

2022 - Preliminary Budget Highlights

001 General Fund

Revenues

- Property Taxes (split between General Fund, Streets, Cemetery)
- Utility Taxes & Franchise Fees new franchise with Comcast
- State Shared Taxes & Fees
- o Permits & Licenses
- o Grants Stonegarden, Dept of Commerce, FEMA, ARPA, WCIA
- o Charges for Services
 - Passports & Fingerprints
 - Facility rentals (see parks below)
- Parks (budget considerations)
 - Slight increase to park user fees in 2021, slow recovery from COVID shut down, expect increase in revenue with completion of Grandstand project
 - Summer Help 1 position in 2021, budgeting for 2 positions in 2022
 - Spray Park 95% complete, wrapping up in 2022 (DOC grant funds)
 - o Howard Bowen Event Center Project underway, expected completion in 2022 (DOC grant funds)
 - New Sidewalks/Trails Project extension of sidewalks/trails from Sumas Ave thru Howard Bowen park to foot bridge, new sidewalk along Columbia St from Sumas Ave to foot bridge, paving pathway thru City Park between Second & Third St (DOC grant funds)

Expenses

- New agenda software
- New Police vehicle in 2022
- Proposed projects for 2022
 - Paint interior of the Senior Center (cost split w/ Whatcom Co Parks Dept)

101 Streets

Revenues

- Property Taxes (split between General Fund, Streets, Cemetery)
- O Local Fuel Tax (2020 reduced 50% due to COVID-19 Border Closure; continued into 2021, 2022?)
- State Shared Motor Vehicle Fuel Taxes

Expenses

- 2022 Street Improvements:
 - Kneuman Rd & Sumas Ave Overlay Storm Damage 2017 (FEMA funding)
 - Sidewalk repairs repairing various damaged sections around town, completing missing segments as we can afford
 - Mitchell St & Lawson St Overlay adjacent to new elementary school (TIB funding, partnership with NVSD)
 - Hovel Rd Culvert Superbowl Flood 2020 A&E study underway to determine FEMA coverage of repairs

103 Cemetery

- Property Taxes (split between General Fund, Streets, Cemetery)
- o routine maintenance anticipated in 2022



104 Econ Dev. Fund

Economic Development Loan Funds available

Funds use to promote business retention in Industrial and Commercial districts

401, 410, 411 - Utilities

Storm Sewer

- o Rate was increased in 2021
- o Added new catch basins and cleaned out storm water ponds and ditches in 2021
- o Routine maintenance anticipated in 2022

Water

- o Water Comp Plan Update in 2022
- o 2021 SCADA system installed
- 2022 adding water storage tank telemetry system

Sewer

- 2021 SCADA system installed at several lift stations
- o 2022 complete panel upgrades at 2 more lift stations, and replace pumps at lift station #7

Light

- o Purchased power-new rate beginning Oct 2021-impact to us approx. 12.5% increase
- o Monitoring light fund in 2022 to determine if our rate to our customers in necessary
- o Bob Mitchell upgrades 2021-2022 2-year project
- Replace bucket truck
- All Utilities experience aging infrastructure, our goal is to budget for anticipated maintenance/repairs and factor those capital costs into our rate structures while trying to keep rates low for our customers

Other Items

Salaries/Benefits

- COLA
 - Social Security benefit increase for 2022 is 5.9%
 - o WA Minimum Wage increases 5.83% in 2022 = \$14.49
 - Proposed increase of 5.9% for City Employees factored into preliminary budget estimates

Medical Insurance Premiums

- Rate increase for 2022 medical plans
 - Kaiser increased 7.3%; Regence increased 5.8%
- Rate increase for 2022 dental plans
 - Delta Dental increased 0%; Willamette Dental increased 10.1%
- o Vision rates for 2022 did not change

City's Liability/Property Insurance for 2022

- o Liability rate increase 19.4%
- o Property rate increase 4%
- o Auto rate increase 3%
