

City of Plymouth

City Overview

- The City of Plymouth is a historic Gold County town and the gateway to the Shenandoah Valley, an extensive wine-producing region.
- Population: 1,250
- Size: 2.7 square miles



Police Department

- Plymouth does not have its own police department.
- The City contracts its law enforcement services with the Amador County Sheriff's Office, providing the City with police protection and dispatching services.

Police Special Revenues

- Has a police impact fee that goes towards their contract with the Sheriff's Office.
- Receives COPS Grant funding that amounts to \$167,000.

Law Enforcement Services Agreement with Sheriff's Office

- The County provides all labor, supervision, equipment, communication facilities, and supplies needed to maintain police protection and dispatching services in the City.
- The City is not responsible for paying salaries, wages, or other compensation to County officers performing law enforcement services for the City.
- The Sheriff will designate a "Liaison" to be the primary contact between the City and Sheriff on operational issues. The Undersheriff is the primary contact for all contractual issues.
- The Sheriff determines the minimum level of Police Protection Services that the County provides.
- At the end of each month, the Sheriff provides the City with a summary of law enforcement activities engaged within the City. If the level of service exceeds expectations, the County and City will discuss an adjustment to the City's payment obligations.
- The City is responsible for addressing all animal issues within its boundaries; if Amador County Animal Control is called upon to respond to animal emergencies, the City will be charged.

- 5% fee escalator each year.
- In the 4/1/2025 - 3/31/2026 period, the cost of law enforcement services per resident is \$310.
