A. Discuss and act (as needed): Mark Morgan: Revitalization of Park and Recreation Board.

Mark Morgan addressed the council and stated he felt there was a need for a committee or board to address our parks. Mr. Cook stated that he was in favor of the board, and we have an Ordinance where a Parks and Recreation Board was established. That board dissipated many years ago though.

Bill Hayes made a motion pending agenda item C. that we reinstate the Park and Recreation Board and have a minimum of 5 members. John Rambo seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

B. Discuss and act (as needed): Council Position 3, Brian Brooks: City Wide Plan and Schedule for Ditch and Culvert Cleaning.

Brian Brooks stated he would like to see the crew clean out ditches and culverts during this season of not mowing so much. City Manager Reese Cook stated that we could utilize several avenues, city crews with our boring machine for smaller jobs and with larger bores we would bring in AIMS and Texas Drainage.

NO ACTION

C. Discuss and act (as needed): Reese Cook, City Manager: Updates and amendments to Park and Recreation Board Subchapters 35.01 through 35.06.

City Manager Reese Cook stated that 35.01 reads "park and recreation board members shall be residents of the city and shall not be employees". Mr. Cook proposes to take that out and add "resides within 10 miles of the city's center". Mr. Cook added this would be a 5-member board. John Rambo made a motion to approve the amendments. Bill Hayes seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

D. Discuss and act (as needed): Reese Cook, City Manager: Conveyance of Easement Portion of land on Peach Street of property formally know as Milt's Mini Mart.

City Manager Mr. Cook stated that the owner of this property would like to take these two plats and combine them into one. (Milt's Mini Mart and the house directly behind it). There is a 6-foot portion of the land that is an easement, it belongs to the city.

Bill Hayes made a motion to approve for the city to deed over the 6-foot easement property to the owners as presented. John Rambo seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

E. Discuss and act (as needed): Reese Cook, City Manager: Transfer of funds from General Enterprise Fund Balance to Disaster/Emergency Contingency Texpool Fund.

Mr. Cook stated that when Hurricane Nicholas hit in September 2021, \$300,000.00 was the number proposed for debris removal. We spent about \$40,000.00 on debris removal from the Disaster Contingency Fund. We didn't have C and D (construction and demo) from this storm so that kept the price down. Mr. Cook would like to increase this fund to be ready for the next emergency. Mr. Cook proposes \$200,000.00. \$100,000.00 from General Fund and \$100,000.00 from the Enterprise Fund to be transferred to the Disaster Contingency Texpool Fund. Bill Hayes made a motion to allow Mr. Cook to transfer the \$200,000.00 to the Disaster Contingency Texpool Fund. John Rambo seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

F. Discuss and act (as needed): Reese Cook, City Manager: Ordinance to Call the 2022 May General Election for Council Positions 1, 3, & 5 and Municipal Judge.

Mr. Cook stated this is our standard practice that we call the city election to be held in May 2022. Charlie Stevenson stated our ordinance reads "Order" the election.

Bill Hayes made a motion to approve the ordinance to Order the City Election for council positions 1,3, &5 and Municipal Judge to be held in May 2022. John Rambo seconded. All were

in favor. Motion carried.

Mr. Cook addressed council that the Texas Water Development Board has allocated around five hundred million for flood studies and flood mitigation studies. Matagorda County and Wharton County got a study for Caney Creek. Brazoria County asked if they could get in on the study too, as Caney Creek flooded in Hurricane Harvey in 2018. This study cost is around \$400,000.00. Our portion of the study is \$108,000.00 to be split between Brazoria County, P66, CPC, The Drainage District and The City of Sweeny. Mr. Cook is asking council for approval to move forward with funds from the city in the amount of \$5,000.00. Brazoria County has stated they would pay \$50k and the Drainage District committed to \$25k.

John Rambo made a motion that we agree to participate in this Interlocal Agreement with Brazoria County for a flood study and to approve spending funds for the study not to exceed \$15,000.00. Bill Hayes seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

H. Discuss and act (as needed): Planned Maintenance Agreement with ASCO for Case Backhoe and Kubota Mini Excavator.

Mr. Cook stated that ASCO has reached out to him and would like the city to go into an agreement with them for maintenance on our Case Backhoe and Kubota Mini Excavator. Sandra Blain made a motion to sign on with ASCO for a planned maintenance agreement for the Case Backhoe and Kubota Mini Excavator. John Rambo seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.
