

Public Notice and Notice of Public Hearing

The City of Sweet Home is completing an Emergency Response Assistance project funded with Community Development Block Grant funds from the Oregon Business Development Department. The location of the project is: Linn County. It is estimated that the project has benefited at least 150 persons of whom 100% are low or moderate income.

A public hearing will be held by the Sweet Home City Council at 6:30 PM on Tuesday, August 23rd in the Council Chambers at Sweet Home City Hall, 3225 Main Street in Sweet Home. One of the purposes of the hearing is for the City Council to obtain citizens views about the project and to take comments about the local government's performance. Another purpose of the hearing is for the City Council to obtain citizen views and to respond to questions and comments about: community development and housing needs, especially the needs of low- and moderate-income persons, as well as other needs in the community that might be assisted with a Community Development Block Grant project; and the proposed project. Written comments are also welcome and must be received by Monday, August 22nd at 3225 Main Street, Sweet Home, Oregon 97386. Both oral and written comments will be reviewed by the City Council.

More information about Oregon Community Development Block Grants, the proposed project, and records about the City's past use of Community Development Block Grant funds is available for public review at Sweet Home City Hall during regular office hours. If displacement becomes necessary, alternatives will be examined to minimize the displacement and provide required/reasonable benefits to those displaced. Any low- and moderate-income housing that is demolished or converted to another use will be replaced.
