Beautification Committee Update

Greg Springman reported that planting was done in the medians on Highway 20 with public works and the Beautification Committee. Springman is encouraging more of a public works effort for safety and traffic concerns, and having the Beautification Committee help more towards the entrances of buildings.

Old Business

<u>City Hall Park</u>: Greg Springman talked about Dahlenburg bridge being moved to the front of the City Hall building. Posts for the fence have been put in and chain link fencing will be put in soon.

New Business

<u>Arbor Day</u> Lena Tucker talked about options for Arbor Day in April 2024 to kick off the event. Tucker proposed tree planting events at Sankey Park or City Hall. Greg Springman mentioned replacing the tree at City Hall, or preserving and saving the tree.

Debra Sue Northern mentioned planting an incense cedar tree at Sankey Park.

Greg Springman proposed kicking off the naming of the pocket park for Arbor Day.

Lena Tucker suggested the February meeting for the deadline to have an idea for the event for Arbor Day.

<u>Sankey Park Phase III Donations:</u> No new donations have been made. Alterations to the grant was proposed to speak at the January meeting. Nancy Patton proposed a spaghetti feed for the fundraiser. Lena Tucker reminded the committee that donation requests made in the beginning of the year work best.

<u>Sweet Home Parks Master Plan surveys:</u> Angela Clegg stated that more promotion of the surveys are needing to be done. Currently the biggest response was from Harvest Festival. More information will be available in January.

<u>Parks budget priority</u>: Angela Clegg stated discussion about the priorities of the budget will be focused around grants and the Sweet Home Master Parks Plan. Funding needs to be clarified in January.

If the match for the Sankey Park Donations aren't made, re calibrating the grant will need to be made.

Round Table Discussions (Committee comments about topics not listed on the agenda)

Nancy Patton asked about the Pocket Park naming at the City council meeting. Angela Clegg encouraged a member of the Park and Tree Committee to attend the City Council meeting in January in regards to the Park and Tree Committee's suggestions to the names of the Pocket Park.

SHMC 1.10 CITY COMMITTEES

§ 2.10.050 POWERS AND DUTIES.

A. Park and Tree Committee. The powers and duties of the Park And Tree Committee shall be as follows:

- 1. To conduct an inventory of existing street trees, including historical trees and public properties in need of beautification and plantings and present a written report to the City Council of its findings;
- To develop and recommend to the City Council, for its adoption, a master list of trees suitable for planting within the city. The list shall be reviewed annually, a copy of which shall be kept on file in the office of the City Recorder for public information;
- 3. To develop and recommend to the City Council, for its adoption, ordinances and policies for the planting, care, maintenance, replacement and protection of trees throughout the city;
- 4. To act in an advisory capacity to the Planning Commission with respect to landscape design, suitable plantings, protection of natural vegetation and street tree requirements;
- 5. To submit recommendations to the City Council regarding the beautification of public properties and rights-of-way;
- 6. To promote public knowledge and acceptance of the value of tree planting and maintenance programs and requirements;
- 7. To develop a capital development program for each fiscal year, to include acquisition of new land and/or development of existing property for parks and other recreation areas;
- 8. To recommend recreation programing needs to be produced by the city;
- 9. To recommend an operating budget to carry out the recreation program as outlined for the forthcoming fiscal year; and
- 10. To preform additional duties and studies as may be required from time to time by the City Council.
- 11. To meet a minimum of four meetings a year, beginning with the month of December, which meeting should be devoted to the development of the next year's capital and recreation programs.
