POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Entering autos and car thefts are still happening. Keys and other belongings are being left inside the majority of vehicles, which make the offender(s) job even easier. Now, Thunderbolt PD, Savannah PD, and the Marshall's Service are all actively investigating these crimes. Some of the crimes involving Savannah PD and the Marshall's Service are merely because they have received tips that the person or persons involved committed other crimes in Savannah's jurisdiction, and those people reside in Thunderbolt.

I'm currently working with PowerDMS so that they can assist PD with keeping us up to date with the latest and most current policies for our SOP manual. This will coincide with what I'm planning to get rolling in a few months and that's getting the police department certified with the State. This particular certification program is through the GMA. They work alongside with GCAP and LGRMS, and essentially walks us through the process of strengthening our departmental policies and practices. The cost is minimal and automatically gives us a 5% reduction in our LGRMS rate once we've successfully completed the certification program. This will be about a year long process but it's one that I feel strongly about, and know will make us a better and more professional police department.
