WHEREAS, American women have been leaders, not only in securing their own rights of suffrage and equal opportunity, but also in the abolitionist movement, the emancipation movement, the industrial labor movement, the civil rights movement, and other movements, especially the peace movement, which create a more fair and just society for all; and

WHEREAS, despite these contributions, the role of American women in history has been consistently overlooked and undervalued, in the literature, teaching and study of American history:

NOW, THEREFORE I, Dana Williams, Mayor of the Town of Thunderbolt do hereby proclaim March 2025 as “WOMEN’S HISTORY MONTH” in the Town of Thunderbolt to encourage activities in honor of the contributions of women across the globe.
