Notable Incidents

On May 12, 2024 at 5:35 p.m., Sgt. Moran and Officer Notter were dispatched to 17 Pawnee for a domestic dispute. Officers observed a female and male yelling at each other. Both parties accused each other of being under the influence of drugs and alcohol and they had a young child with them. The issue was a child custody disagreement with no documented court custody paperwork on file. The child was turned over to his mother and officers notified DCFS of the incident.

On May 14, 2024 at 11:01 p.m., Officers Leone and Bennett were dispatched to 30 Blackhawk for a neighbor dispute involving a knife. An intoxicated subject was knocking on his neighbor's window and when the victim confronted the intoxicated subject outside, the intoxicated subject began to wave a large kitchen knife around. Officers recovered a large kitchen knife and placed the intoxicated male under arrest and he was charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon.

On May, 28 2024 at 02:08 a.m., Officers Leone and Bennett assisted the Sauk Village Police Department with the pursuit of a stolen vehicle that was wanted in connection to an armed robbery. Officers proceeded to the area of Forest & Schwab, observing the wanted vehicle. The occupants of the vehicle bailed out of the stolen car in the 300 block of Schwab. Officers pursued the suspects who fled into the forest. A perimeter was set and a request for a K-9 and drone were made. The stolen auto was removed from the scene by Tinley Park Police for investigation of the armed robbery. Later in the morning, Officers Dust and Wiley were dispatched to the 200 block of Maple for 3 suspicious subjects. The subjects were covered in mud and weeds and were observed exiting the forest. The 3 subjects matched the description of the subjects that bailed out of the stolen auto. The 3 subjects were placed under arrest and charged with criminal trespass to motor vehicle by Thornton Police, then turned over to Tinley Park Police for further investigation of the armed robbery. A handgun was recovered from the area of Forest and Brownell. The handgun was taken as evidence and submitted to the state crime lab.
