

**NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES)  
MS4 – MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORM SEWER SYSTEM  
PUBLIC MEETING – APRIL 6, 2026**

**The National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Program is a federal and state regulatory program administered by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and implemented in Illinois by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) through General Permit ILR40. The program is intended to reduce pollutants in stormwater runoff that discharge through municipal storm sewer systems to local waterways. Municipalities regulated under the permit must implement a comprehensive stormwater management program designed to prevent pollutants from entering the storm sewer system and ultimately reaching rivers, lakes, and streams.**

**As part of the Village's on-going efforts to eliminate pollutants from entering the storm sewer system and depositing into rivers, lakes, creeks, etc., Robinson Engineering will be providing information on what the Village has done this last year to meet the six minimum control measures of the IEPA Permit listed below.**

**Six Required Minimum Control Measures**

- 1) Public Education and Outreach**
- 2) Public Involvement and Participation**
- 3) Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination**
- 4) Control of Construction Site Storm Water Runoff**
- 5) Post-Construction Storm Water Management**
- 6) Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping**
