## **Special Provisions**

- General:
  - Updated language to prohibit piñatas and water recreation activities.
  - Updated language to allow water recreation activities at Park for special events approved by City Council, or as approved by the City Manager.
- Railroad Depot Gazebo:
  - Updated name to reflect gazebo only, as that is the only facilities that may be rented.
- Juergens Park:
  - Clarified that reservations apply to the pavilion only.
  - Specified that vehicles may not remain parked inside the park during a reservation.
- Jerry Matheson Park:
  - Clarified that reservations apply to the pavilion only.
  - Added requirement for reservations including pool use to contact the Pool Manager in advance to confirm availability.

#### **Enforcement**

Added language to specify Parks Superintendent.
