Homeless Solutions Aligns with Town Priorities

I. Housing Policy in Place (Housing Element, Part of the General Plan

Supportive housing is an allowed residential use (Dev. Code 18.08, 18.220) Affordable and workforce housing goals (HE goal H-2)

2. Safety is a Top Priority


- Crime prevention housed people result in fewer service calls than unhoused
- Fire Prevention reduced risk of fire starts if people live in homes, not the woods

3. Community Character and Cohesion—Council Priority

- Town Vision -Welcoming and inclusive
- Facilitate a culture of inclusion (CC-6.1)
- Collaborate to provide mental health and homeless services (CC-6.6)



Town Working on Housing Solutions Across the Housing Bridge




Example of Town of Truckee Housing Programs and Investments

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
What is the Action Plan?

- Regional roadmap and vision to guide collective action for homeless services
- Goal is to end homelessness in the region in 5 years
- North Star for partners

How was the Action Plan Created?

- Review of existing County Homeless Action Plans,
 Town of Truckee Housing Element
- Review of data—3 years
- Audit of existing services—interviews with providers
- Input from those with lived experience
- Community feedback
- Stakeholder process—18 months (Tahoe Truckee Homeless Advisory Committee)
- Best practice research—what's working in other communities similar to us




