My insurance Allstate for homeowners Skislope has changed my classification to a 10 ISO because the closest fire station full time is 5.6 miles away which is an increased risk even though the fire hydrant closest is less than 100 feet away. There rules for safety are full time less than 5 miles away for fire stations.
