



**Request for Proposals:
Temporary Public Art installation for the Truckee Railyard Mobility Hub
Public Art Commission of Truckee, Town of Truckee California**

Location: Truckee Railyard Mobility Hub, 10930 Church Street, Truckee, CA 96161

Project Overview: The Town of Truckee and the Public Art Commission of Truckee (PACT) invite artists and artist teams to propose a temporary public art piece for installation at the brand-new Mobility Hub for 2 years. We hope the art will inspire public interaction and enhance the community space. All media suitable for mountain climates welcome!

Funding: \$5,000 available (includes installation, transportation & removal). Option to sell your artwork during the loan period with a 20% commission to the Town if sold.

Project Scope: Installations may be located in the 18' x 19' designated corner pad (main site); transit shelters; benches; metal trellis; shade structures; or others areas as approved by the Town.

Who Can Apply: All artists welcome – local, emerging & youth encouraged!
Collaborations and community partnerships are a plus.

Summary

The Town of Truckee invites artists or artist teams to submit a proposal for outdoor artwork to be temporarily displayed at the new Truckee Railyard Mobility Hub located at 10930 Church Street, Truckee, California 96161. The submittals received from this Request for Proposals (RFP) will be evaluated by the Public Art Commission of Truckee (PACT) and the Town of Truckee. An artist or artist team will be selected to display their artwork at the Mobility Hub for a maximum of two years with a payment of \$5,000. Design and construction of any foundation and installation of the work will be the responsibility of the Town of Truckee (Town).

The Mobility Hub is the new transit center in the Railyard area of Truckee and it includes bus bays, shelters, benches, paver sidewalks, and a restroom. The Town is currently working to design a small building for the site that will provide a heated space for passengers to wait, as well as a break room for the transit drivers. This site includes an area in the southeast corner of the site that was specifically reserved for public art (Photos 1, 2, and 3). There are opportunities to display temporary artwork in this area as well as other areas of the Mobility Hub, as discussed in the “Project Site Information” section.

Objective / Artwork Goal

The selected artwork will enhance the aesthetic appeal of the site and provide visual interest to the area, create an opportunity for interaction that enhances experience of the public realm, and inspires creative thinking. The temporary art installation could be an opportunity for: experimental artwork, youth artwork, local artists, and emerging artists. The artwork may be an existing piece or a new creation.

Project Site Information

The Mobility Hub in Truckee is bordered by Church Street and the Union Pacific Railroad “balloon track”. The balloon track is a loop that enables the railroad’s snow removal engine to turn around at the end of the line and traces a wide loop with the Mobility Hub inside a portion of the loop (Photo 2). Additional Mobility Hub information and a site plan are in Attachment A.

The PACT is open to proposals for temporary art to be placed at or incorporated into the following locations/amenities, but will also consider other locations if proposed by an artist (although not guaranteed to be approved):

1. The corner designed for temporary art, shown in Photos 1, 2, and 3. The area is approximately 18 ft by 19 ft (340 sq ft). The Town of Truckee will be installing sculpture foundation(s) based on the proposals received. One large foundation or several smaller foundations could fit in this area.
2. Hanging temporary art on the transit bus shelters (Photos 3, 4, and 5).*
3. Art attached to the metal trellis that is located on the south side of the restroom (Photo 7). The specifications for the trellis are in Attachment B.*
4. On or near the benches (Photos 3, 4, and 6).
5. Art incorporated into the shade structures (shade fabric is removed in the winter months) (Photos 3 and 6).

*Note that locations 2 and 3 provide particularly good opportunities for youth art collaborations.

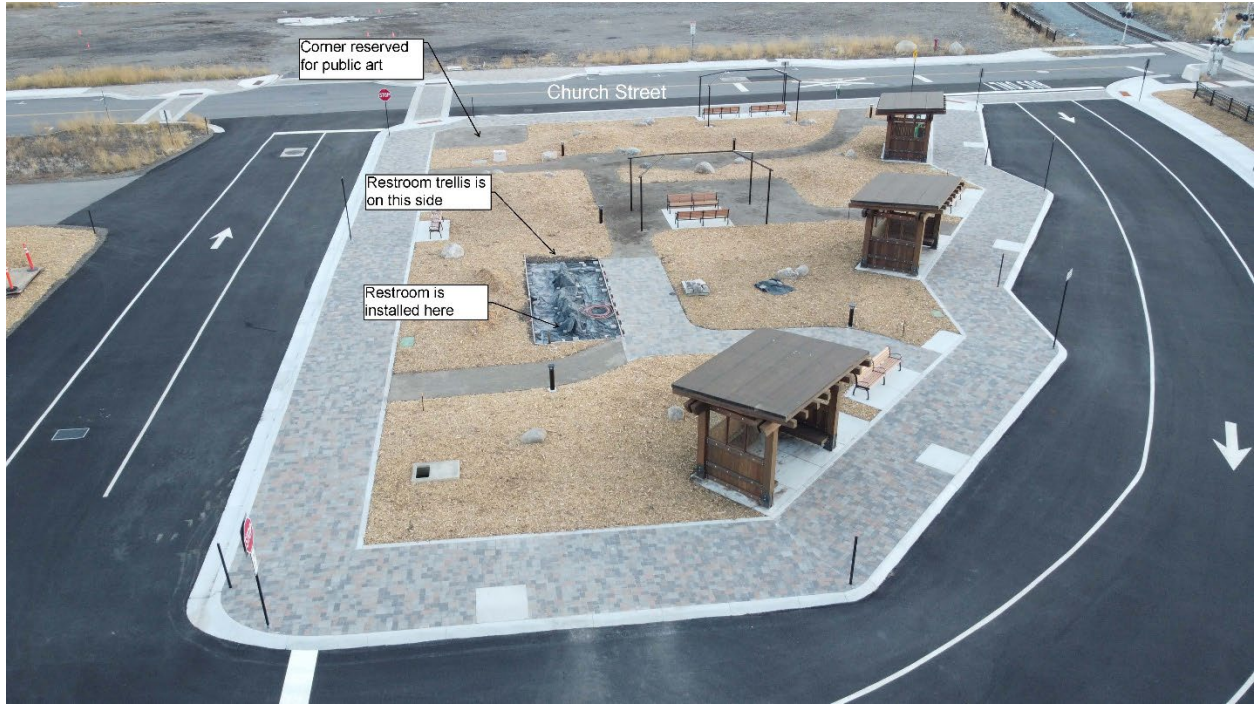

Public Survey Results

Town staff posted an online survey to gather input on potential themes and ideas for the site. The results of the survey are provided in Attachment C. Note that this survey should just be used for ideas and inspiration and in no way restricts the themes or look of the proposed art.

Timing

The intent is to install the art within 1-2 months of executing contracts. Therefore, existing pieces would be more suitable in most cases.

Artwork Specifications for Sculptures

- The southeast corner of the Mobility Hub will be reserved for sculptures. Based on the proposals received, the foundation for the sculpture will be designed and installed by the Town. One large sculpture or several smaller sculptures could fit in this area. The footprint of the sculpture or sculptures must fit in the corner area (18 ft by 19 ft).
- The sculpture must be able to be securely anchored to the future concrete pad with bolts provided by the artist.
- Artwork must weigh no more than 2,000 pounds.
- Any projections beyond the perimeter of the pad must occur at a minimum of 7' above the ground.
- Sculptures must be structurally safe for display in public and must not have the potential to cause injury. All components must be securely fastened.

- Sculptures must arrive in the same condition as portrayed in the photographs. The commission reserves the right to refuse a sculpture upon arrival if it does not match the photographs submitted.

Artwork Specifications for other Locations

Artwork at locations other than the corner at the Mobility Hub must not impact any ADA path of travel or create substantial damage to the transit shelters, trellis, benches, shade structures or any other feature at the Mobility Hub. Artwork must be an appropriate size and shape.

Media

All media appropriate for outdoor exposure to the climate in a mountainous environment, with considerations for extreme weather, temperature, snow, and sun will be considered. The art must be free-standing, self-sufficient, and able to withstand heavy snow loads and snow removal from sidewalks and paths using a snowblower. Artwork proposed for one of the other locations must also withstand snow loads and snow removal operations. The elevation at the Mobility Hub is about 5,810 ft and the ground snow load for design is 169 pounds per square foot. All proposals must include evidence that the artwork materials will endure the location conditions.

Expected Life and Maintenance

The minimum lifespan of the artwork shall be two years. The artwork must also adhere to all the safety standards required by the Town. The selected artist will be required to provide an appropriate maintenance plan for the two-year display period.

Budget

The Town will pay the artist \$5,000 within 14 days of successful installation and receipt of a complete W-9. This includes shipping and transportation to and from the installation site.

Art For Sale

The artist will have the option of offering the artwork for sale during its 2-year loan period with the Town. The Town will receive a 20% commission if the artwork is sold during the duration of this loan. Artists must provide a narrative, artist biography, artist contact information, and pricing to be shared online via the Town’s website and social media platforms. The artwork must remain on the site during the entire 2-year loan unless sold.

Eligibility

All artists are eligible. Local, emerging, and youth artists are encouraged to apply. Partnering or mentoring with youth, seniors, or other under-represented community members is encouraged.

Terms

The selected artist will be required to enter into an agreement with the Town, a draft of which is attached (Attachment D). If the artist is unable to meet any of the terms or conditions of the proposed agreement, those terms should be identified in the proposal as well as recommended changes.

Note that late submittals will be rejected and failure to include any of the information may also result in the proposal being rejected as incomplete.

All pages should be labeled with the Artist name and contact information.

- 1) Name and contact information (phone number, email, and mailing address) of the artist or primary contact for the artist team. If the proposal is being submitted by a team, provide the name of each artists as well as a brief biography.
- 2) Recommended: A resume or CV listing artist qualifications and/or relevant experience. If proposing an artist team, include relevant qualifications team members.
- 3) Recommended: Two professional references who may support the artist's/artist team's ability to deliver the project on time.
- 4) Optional: Up to three examples of relevant work (if desired) with a description, photos, cost, and references.
- 5) A clear and concise description of your artwork proposal (no more than 3 pages), indicating the inspiration for your idea. Include a project name, description of materials, detailed dimensions of artwork, weight, date completed, method of installation, cleaning and maintenance instructions, and sales price.
- 6) At least 3 high quality images of the artwork that accurately represent it. Images files should be no more than 2 MB in size. Only jpeg, png and pdf file types will be accepted. Image files must be labeled in the order they will be viewed and include the artist name, e.g. *{01_JaneSmith_myartwork.jpg}*
- 7) If possible, a photo or drawing of your artwork as it relates to the site location.

Public Record

All proposals will be subject to public disclosure per the "California Public Records Act" (California Government Code Sections 6250-6270) and will be posted to the Town website as a part of the Public Art Commission of Truckee's application review workshop and selection process. Any proposal section alleged to contain proprietary information will be identified by the Artist in boldface text at the top and bottom as "PROPRIETARY." Designating the entire proposal as proprietary is not acceptable and will not be honored. Submission of a proposal will constitute an agreement to this provision for public record. Cost information is not considered proprietary information.

Criteria for Selection

The RFP submittals will be evaluated based on originality and innovation; relevance; and compatibility with the site context, including the Railyard area and Mobility Hub.

The Town staff will also review the selected artwork to confirm that it is appropriate for the site and site conditions, is safe and suitable for public display, and is something Town staff can maintain. The PACT will hold a public meeting to conduct a review of the RFP submittals and select an artwork.

Once selected, the commissioned artist will enter into a contract with the Town and will be required to submit a more detailed approach for delivery and installation.

The Town reserves the right to reject any and all proposals.

Attachment A: Additional Mobility Hub Site information and Site Plan Phase 1

The Mobility Hub provides a public transit passenger facility to accommodate current and future, local and regional transportation needs, as well as promote active transportation modes, such as walking and biking. The project has been designed to allow buses to enter the site on a one-way travel lane off Church Street with bus bays adjacent to the travel pathway, creating increased safety between pedestrians and buses when loading and unloading.

The site includes improved access and internal transit circulation, transit vehicle pull-outs, passenger shelters, stormwater treatment, sidewalks, restrooms, bike fix-it-stations and racks, shade structures, benches, space for Truckee's new E-bike Share stations, parking, electrical vehicle chargers, and a restroom.

The site is located in the Railyard Master Plan area, which provides the following guidance regarding Public Art:

Public Art

Public art provides visitors and residents of Truckee with a visual landmark, large or small, that inspires a sense of identity, pride and creativity. Art can be geared toward "cultural representations" of the area, which focus on the historic and indigenous character of the Town. This presents an opportunity not only to enhance public spaces, but also to celebrate the Town's historic character and cultural diversity. The repetition of public art would enhance the Town's green spaces, provide interest to users, and offer another element to unify the Town. The trail system in Truckee lends a unique opportunity to accommodate public art with spaces made available at trailheads and at key locations along the trail. (G10)

Guidelines

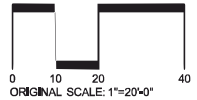
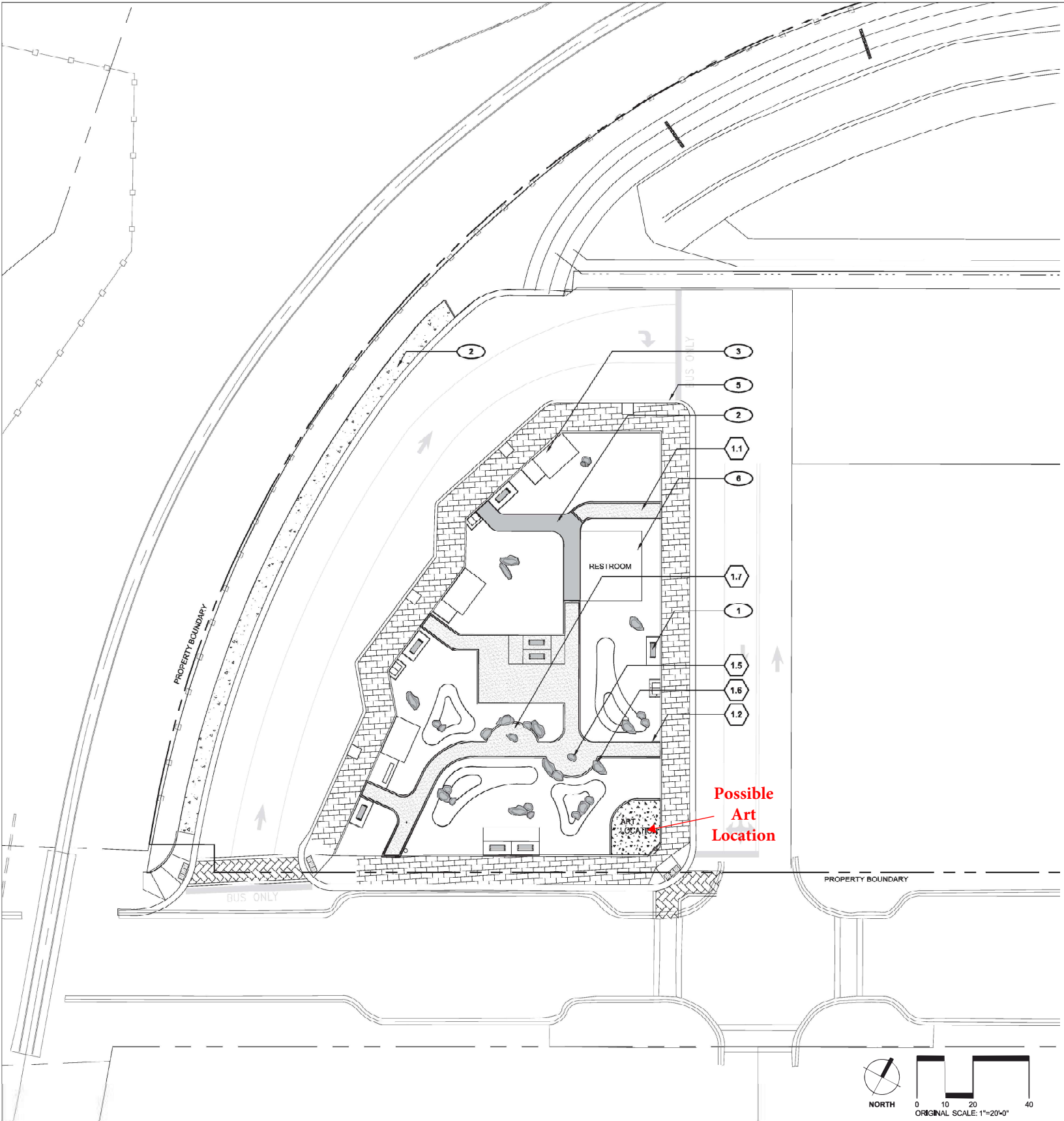
- *Public art should incorporate the area's cultural heritage by recognizing key historic individuals and events. (G10a)*
- *Art should be incorporated wherever feasible into building architecture, plazas, and parks. (G10b)*
- *Public art may include items big and small such as tilework, enhanced paving, skateboard deterrents, murals, sculptures, statues, etc. (G10c)*
- *Public art that reflects the site's railroad and lumber mill history is encouraged. (G10d)*
- *Consider public art installations (wall murals, free standing sculptures, and decorative sidewalk mosaics, etc.) within public spaces of the Railyard Master Plan Area as development projects are reviewed (per DTSP Chapter 9, Parks and Gateways). (G20 Standards)*
- *Public art shall be incorporated into the design of the community gathering spaces (per DTSP Chapter 9, Parks and Gateways). (S20)*

The Railyard Streetscape Plan also includes the following guidelines:

- *Incorporate public art opportunities at both the street level and at key building locations.*
- *Art will play a major role in providing color. Art should be integrated into the paving, wall murals, kiosks, bike racks etc.*
- *Art installations to highlight unique Truckee features.*

- *Inspired by the concept of “Truckee funk”, color and form-follows function concepts are encouraged to set the area apart from the existing downtown.*
- *Streetscapes to include artistic bike racks, tree grates or other usable unusual streetscape amenities.*
- *Larger standalone art installations will be considered for on-site terminated view vista’s or as part of on-site developments in the balloon track area.*

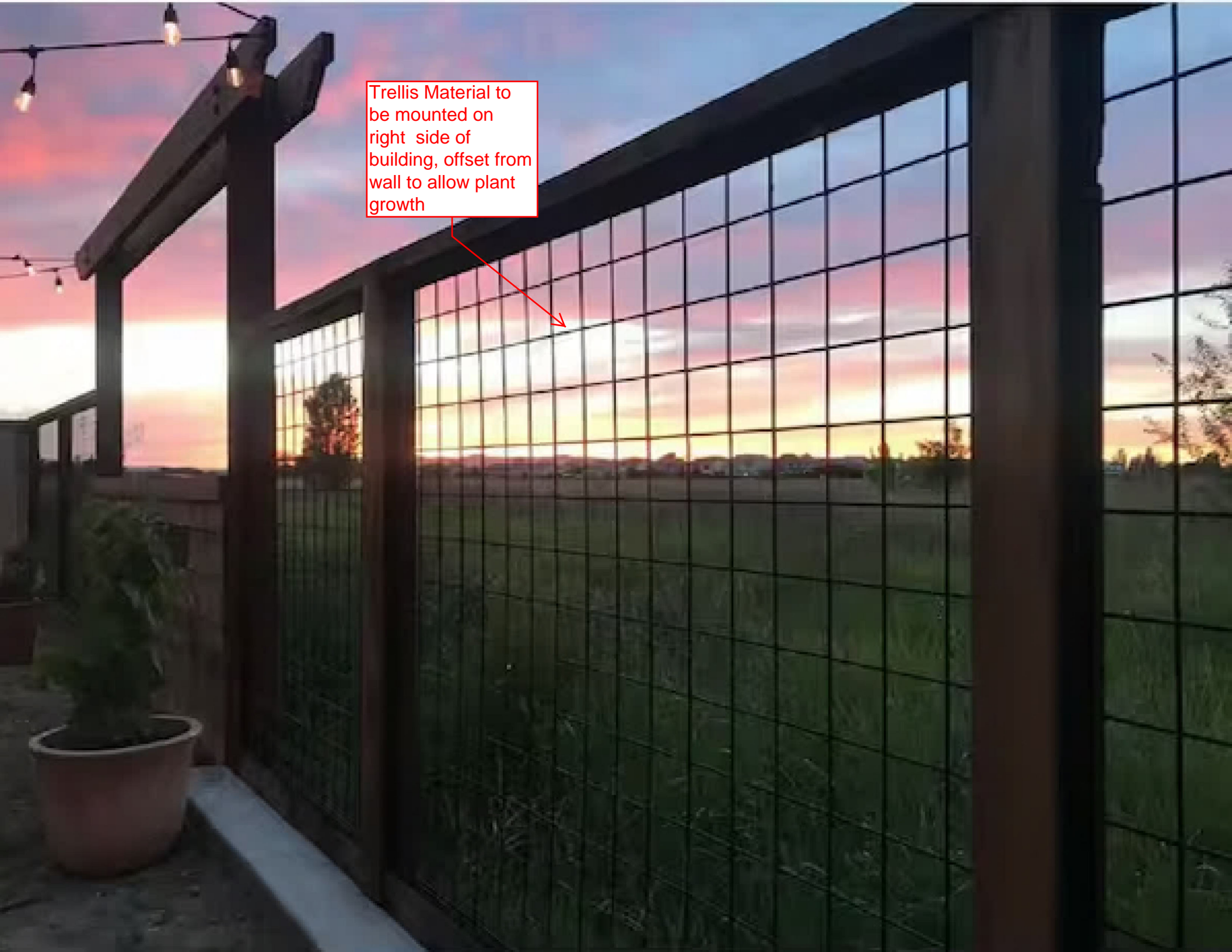

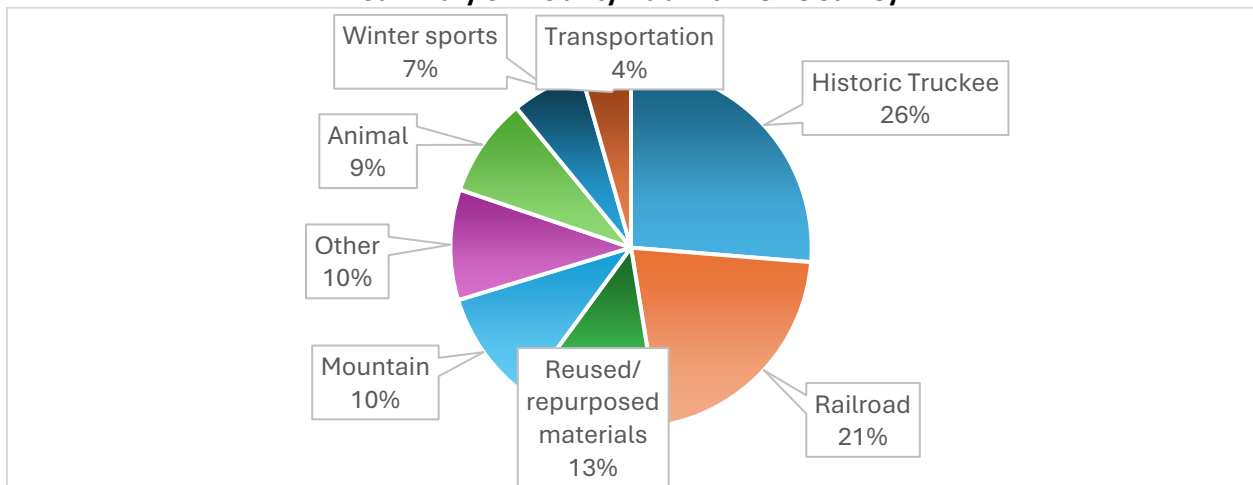

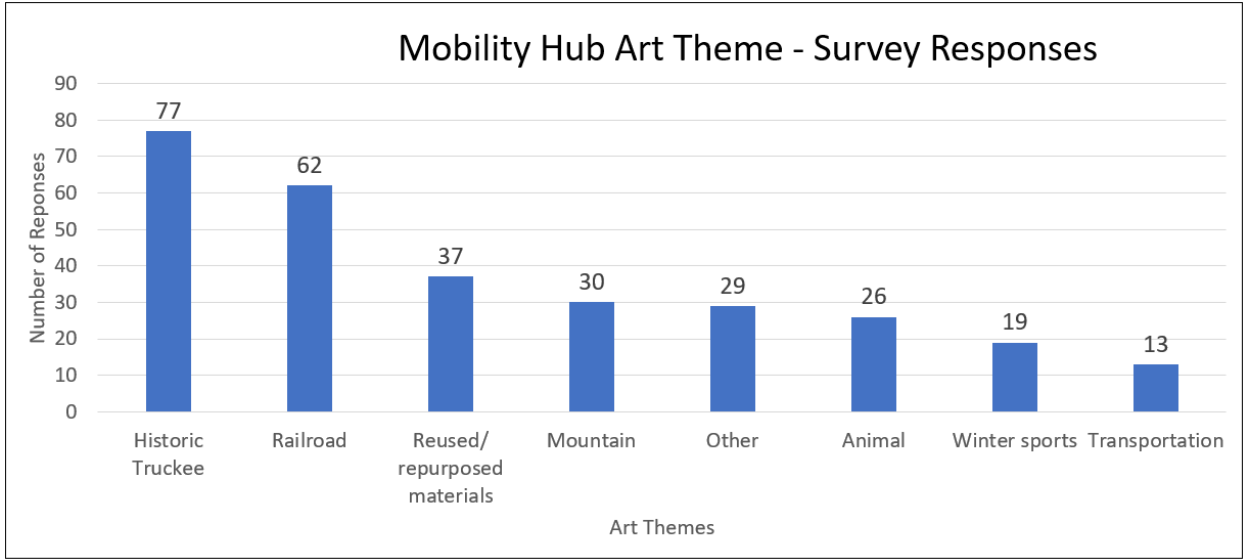
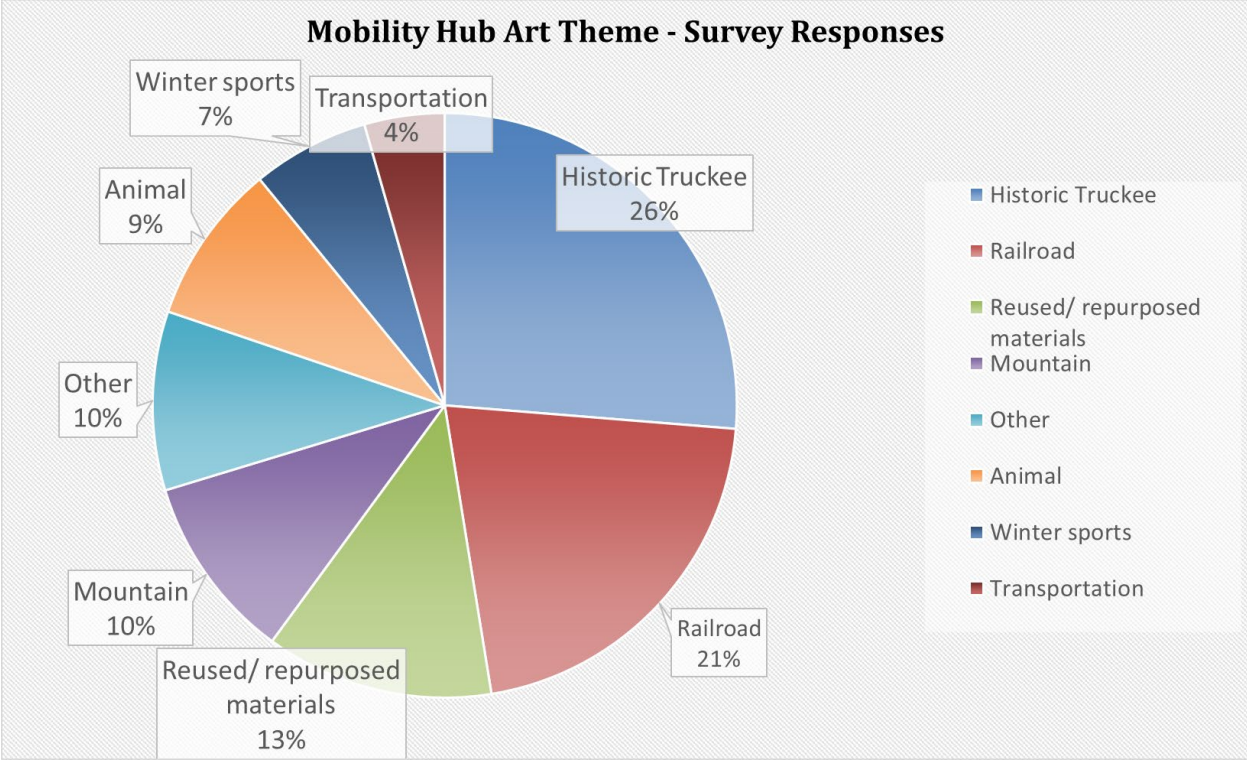
Mobility Hub Dedicated Art Space

Our local rivers and streams have been put to the test - from logging, road construction, industry, development, and golf courses dotting the headwaters – streams like Trout Creek, and the Truckee River have witnessed survived a lot of change over the centuries. It would be really cool to build a hub of art that explores and demonstrates our love and appreciation for this great natural resource of ours. -Scott Ferguson

Town of Truckee Public Art Display Agreement

This Agreement is made between _____ (“Artist”) and the Town of Truckee, a municipal corporation, (“Town”).

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Artist wishes to provide a piece of art (hereafter referred to as “Work”) titled “_____” for display at _____ for public view and enjoyment; and

WHEREAS, Town wishes to provide a temporary location for the display of “_____” for public view and enjoyment.

THEREFORE, Artist and Town agree as follows:

1. **The Work:** The Work to be displayed is entitled _____ and consists of _____ (materials).

The value of the Work is listed at \$_____. (Documentation required)

The Work is depicted and described in detail in Attachment 1 to this Agreement, which is incorporated herein by this reference.

2. **Term:** The term of this Agreement is for two years commencing on _____ and terminating on _____. If mutually agreed upon by the Artist and the Town, this Agreement can be extended. The Work shall be displayed for the duration of this Agreement unless sold. If the Work is sold during the term of this Agreement, Artist is encouraged to replace the sculpture with another, subject to approval of Town’s Public Art Commission.

3. **Location:** The location for installation of the Work shall be _____.

4. **Work for Sale:** Artist agrees that the Work is For Sale and the listed price of the Work will be \$_____. Artist agrees that Town shall receive a commission of _____ of the sale price if the Work (and/or any duplication of the Work) is sold during the duration of this Agreement and any extensions.

5. **Installation:** A written plan for the installation of the Work (installation plan) is appended to and made a part of this Agreement. Artist will manage and complete the installation, in coordination with Town.

6. **Maintenance:** Artist warrants that the Work is intended to be displayed outdoors, and shall be responsible for any protective measures required for such display. Town shall clean the Work while on display at a frequency determined by Town. Artist shall maintain the Work so that it does not deteriorate in an aesthetic or functional manner. Town reserves the right to inspect and review the Work periodically for safety and maintenance issues. Town reserves the right to maintain the Work at Artist's expense if Artist is given written notice of the need for maintenance and Artist fails to provide maintenance by a reasonable deadline communicated to Artist in writing. Artist acknowledges that Town and its officers, officials, and employees shall not be responsible or liable for any deterioration of, or damage to, the Work while it is on display.
7. **Insurance:** Town will provide property insurance coverage for the value of the Work through Town's coverage through its joint powers insurance pool. Artist shall provide photographs, a narrative of the Work, and art valuation declaration to Town.
8. **Removal:** If the Work poses any threat to public safety, Town may remove the Work without first notifying Artist. Town may notify Artist requesting repair or removal if the Work is damaged or is not adequately enduring the exposure outdoors. Artist may not remove the Work for any reason other than a sale of the Work during the term of this Agreement without a written request and agreement with the Town. If the Work is sold during the course of this term, the Artist will have the option to remove the piece and submit a new application for a replacement piece in that location with 30 days of its removal and under a new agreement. The Town is under no obligation to accept the replacement piece.
9. **Marketing and Promotion:** Artist shall provide a narrative about the sculpture, Artist bio, Artist contact information, and pricing that can be incorporated in a Town provided plaque adjacent to the art installation and/or on the website and for promotional purposes. Artist hereby grants the Town a non-exclusive license to use this information for marketing of Town's public art program and/or Town facilities, and Artist warrants that it has the legal right to grant the Town such license.
10. **Status of Artist:** Any services performed by Artist, its officers, agents, employees and/or volunteers, will be performed as an independent contractor and in pursuit of those persons' independent calling, and not as an employee of Town. Artist, its officers, agents, employees and/or volunteers shall not be considered an employee of the Town for any purpose or under any circumstance.
11. **Indemnification:** Artist shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless Town, and its officers, agents, employees and volunteers from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses including attorney fees arising out of the performance of this Agreement including, but not limited to, Town's use of information regarding the Work for promotional purposes, caused in whole or in part by the willful misconduct or any negligent act or omission of Artist, any subcontractor of Artist, anyone directly or indirectly employed by Artist or anyone for whose acts Artist may be liable, except where caused by and only to the extent of the active negligence, sole negligence, or willful misconduct of Town. Town and Artist expressly agree that any reasonable payment, attorney's fee, costs or expense Town incurs or makes to or on behalf of an injured

photographically reproduce images of the Work, and to authorize third parties to photographically reproduce any and all of the same, as desired by the Town, without prior approval of or compensation to Artist or the artist of the Work, for educational, public information, advertising or promotional purposes. On each such reproduction, Artist and the artist of the Work shall be acknowledged. A copy of the agreement between Artist and the artist of the Work, granting Artist the rights contemplated by this paragraph, is attached hereto as Exhibit A and fully incorporated herein by this reference.
