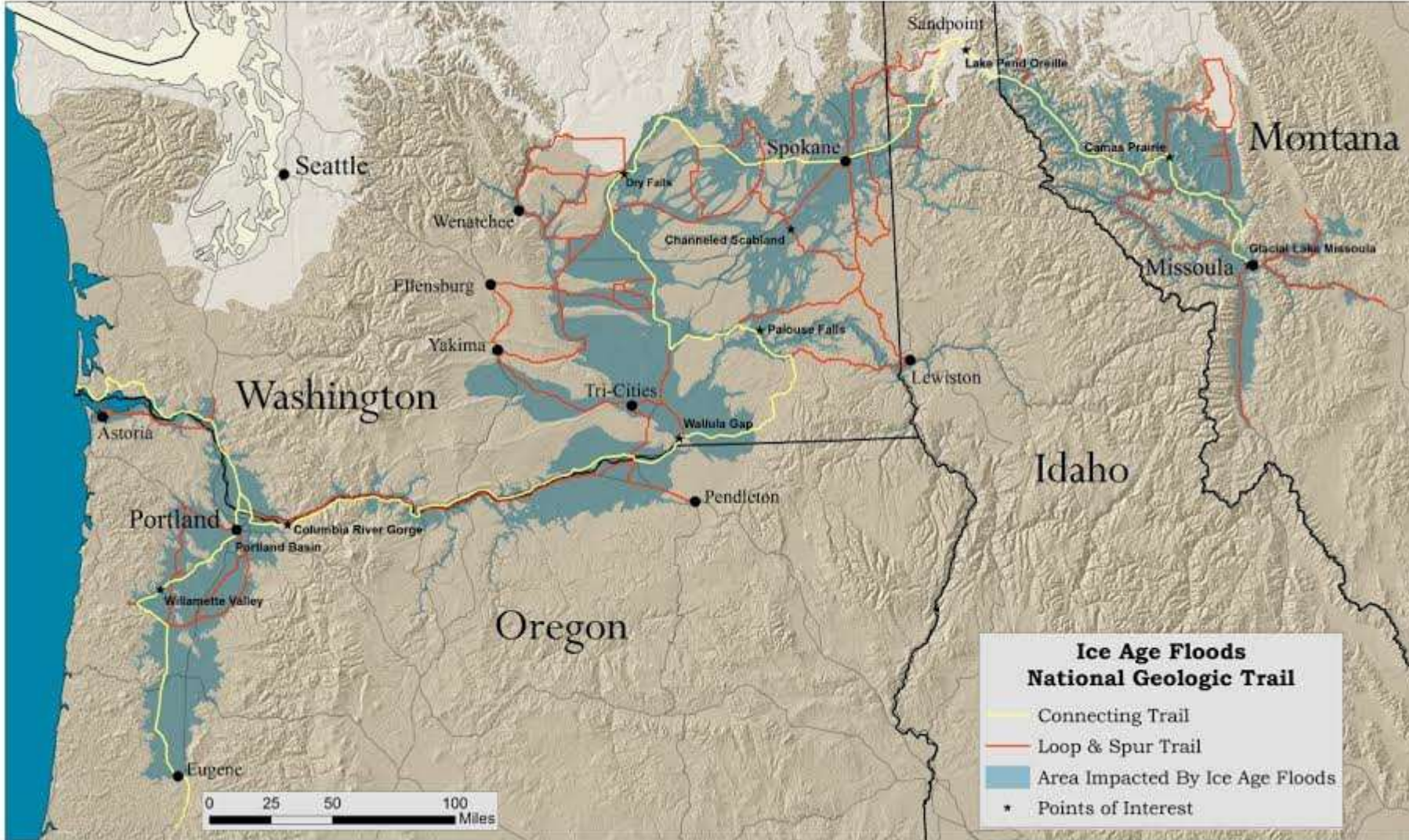

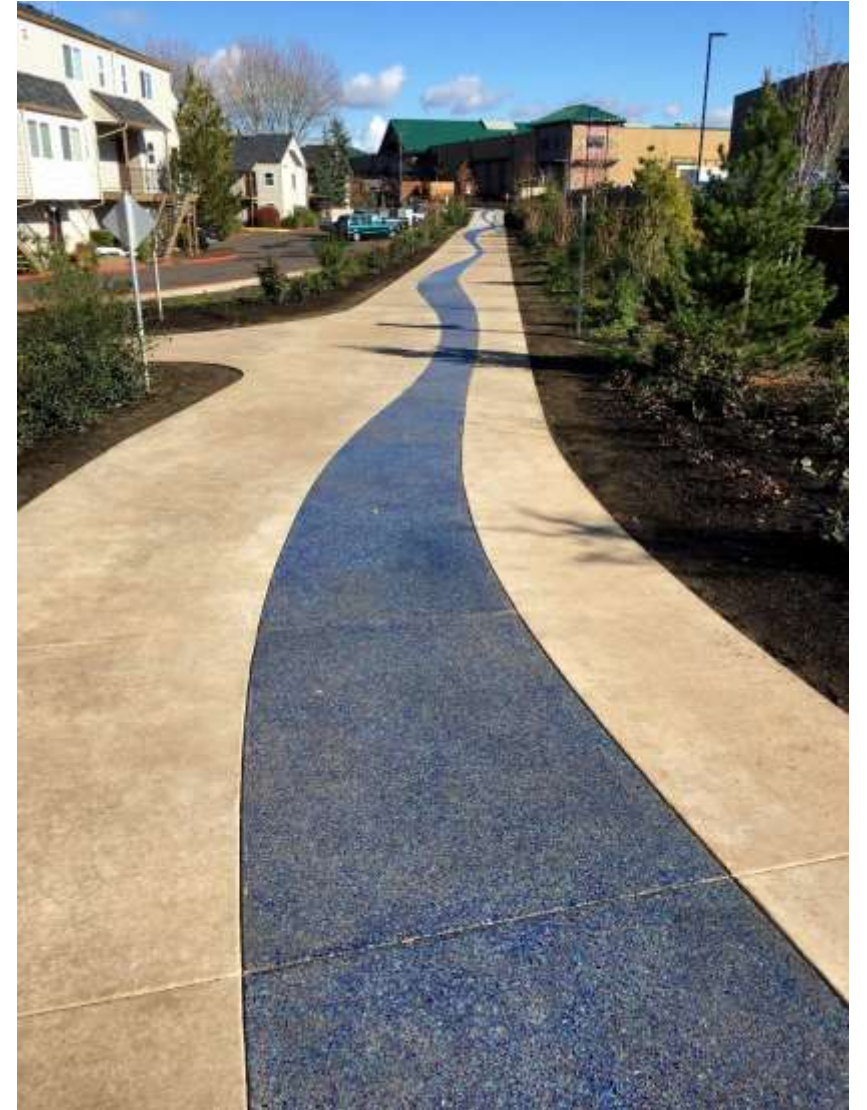


Our Vision

 - as part of the National Park Service & Ice Age Floods National Geologic Trail

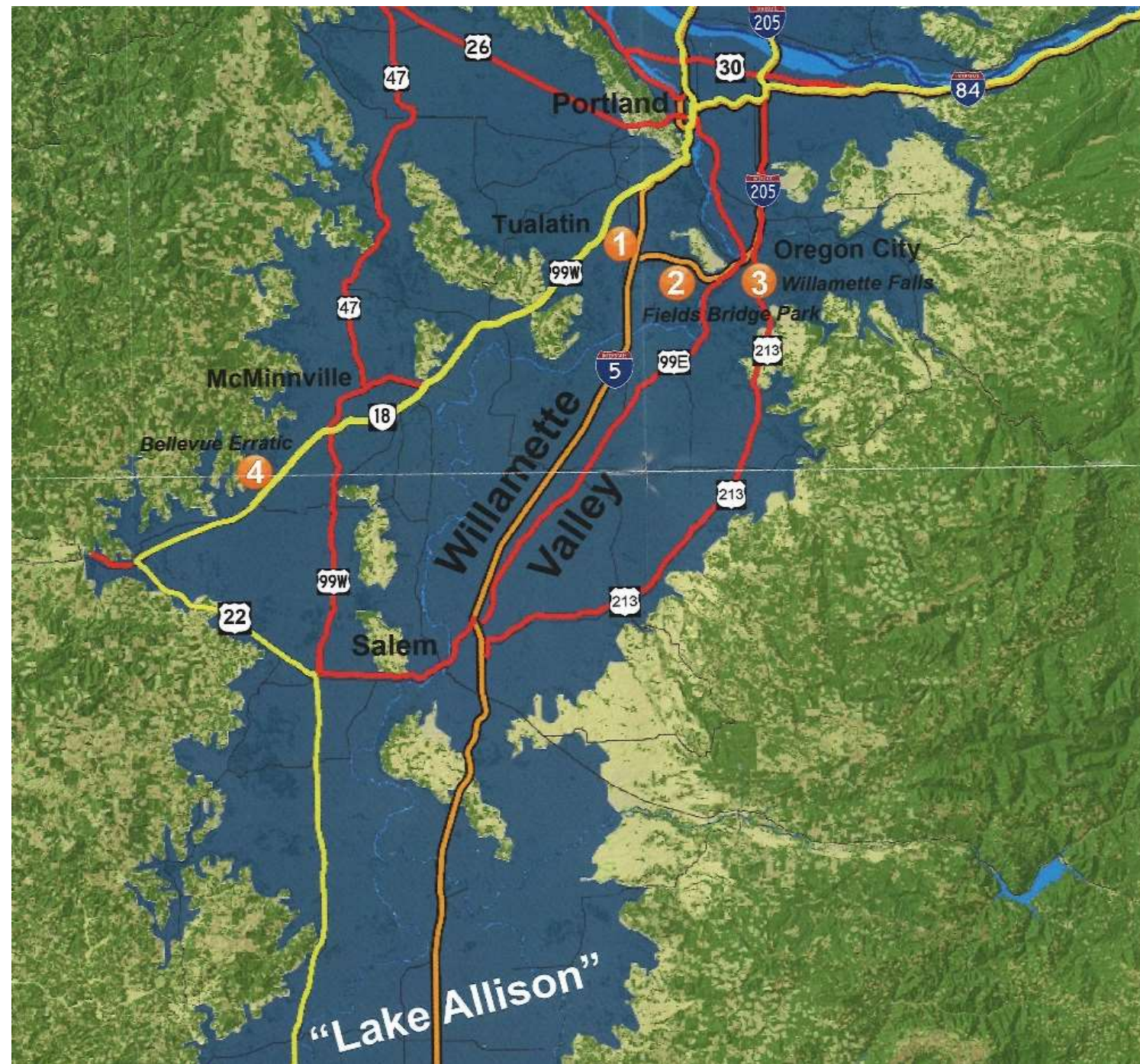
Current Status
