Future TriMet Transit Planning

- **TriMet is currently working on Forward Together 2.0** A 2045 long-range service plan for bus and Max
- Goals:
 - **Increase ridership and mode share**
 - **Respond to community needs**
 - Position TriMet and partners to seek future funding.
- Staff attended a Forward Together 2.0 Workshop on May 8, 2024 and submitted feedback regarding routes being studied.
- FX System Plan is in progress

Washington County's 2023-2028 MSTIP **Funding Cycle – Status**

- WCCC approved County Staff's proposed MSTIP 3f allocation recommendation on March 18
 - Total Package = \$250m
 - Includes Tualatin's Herman Road (124th Ave to • **Cipole Rd) / Herman/Cipole intersection** improvements project = \$17.3m
- MSTIP 3f is scheduled for adoption at the June 4 **Board meeting.**
- > The County's Budget Committee approved a 5% reduction for MSTIP for FY2024-25.

ODOT Funding & Revenue Needs

General Message:

Without structural reform to the State Highway Fund, there will be reductions of service in the future.

With sufficient and reliable funding, ODOT will **Prioritize:**

- **Restoring essential maintenance services** \bullet Improving customer service gaps
- Addressing safety issues
- Fulfilling HB 2017 Commitments

ODOT's Two Budgets:



Capital Projects:

- Major Projects
- New Interchanges
- Major Paving Projects
- Large Programs

These receive directed and dedicated Federal Funds and State funding that is statutorily prescribed and directed to completing large capital constructions projects and grant programs




Maintenance & Agency Operations:

- Road Maintenance
- DMV and Commerce Compliance
- Central Administrative Functions

Work funded by State Highway Fund Dollars.

2023-25 Legislative Budget = \$6.1b



Mechanisms that Support the State Highway Fund:

- Gas Tax
- **Motor Carrier Fees**
- **DMV** Fees (licensing, vehicle registration)

State Highway Fund Funding Challenges



- **Future Fuels Tax Revenue Decline:**
- **Fuel Efficient Vehicles**
- Hybrid Vehicles
- **EVs**

<u>Rigid Statutory Structure:</u>

- **Collection Costs**
- City & County Apportionments
- **Debt Service**



Reliance on Few Sources of Revenue

Oregon Does not utilize inflationresistant funding mechanisms to support transportation system needs



Rise of Record Inflation

- National Highway Construction Cost Index = 80% increase since 2017
- Equipment = 25% in the last 4 years
- Paint = 30% in the last 4 years

Future Funding Gaps:

- Service Functions and Safety System Investments = **\$1.8b**
- HB 2017 Commitments:
 - I-5 Rose Quarter = \$1.5b \$1.7b
 - I-205 Improvements = \$545m \$615m

Options for the Future:

- Index to inflation (gas tax, motor carriers, DMV)
- Road User Charge
- Tolling
- General Fund Sources
- Solutions that have not been identified
