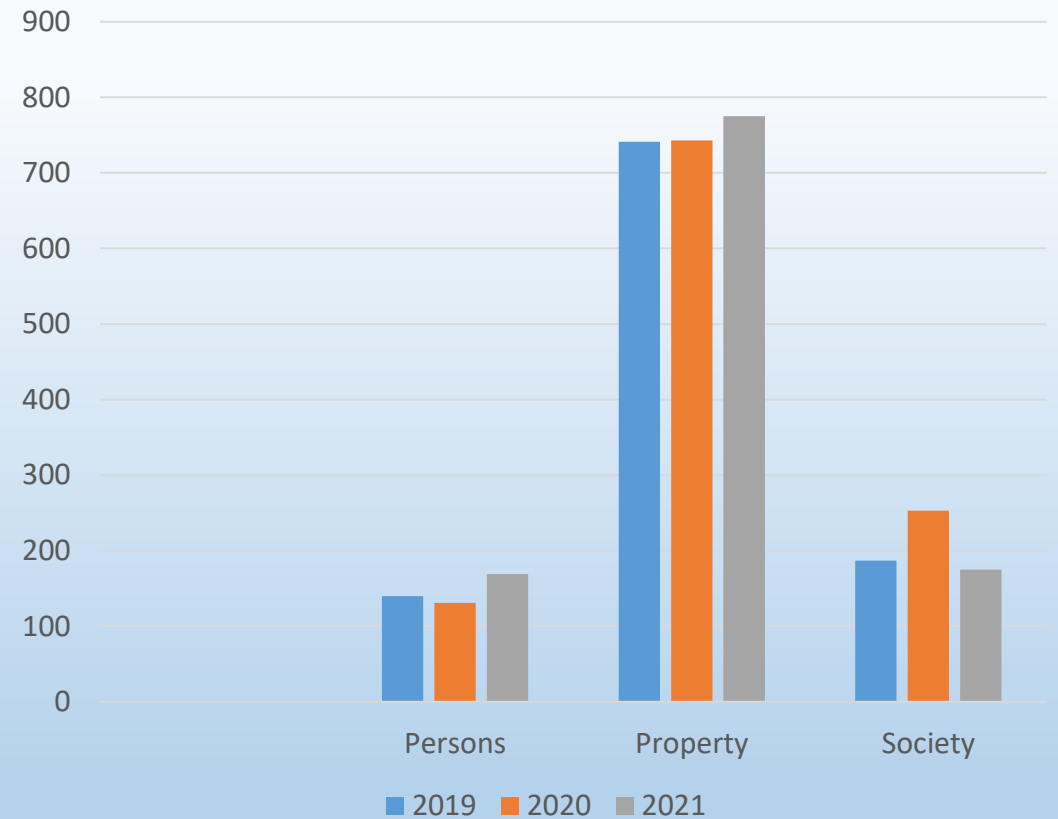

- \$77million dollar countywide bond passed in 2016
 - New 911 center and system seismic upgrades
 - Build new digital radio system to replace outdated analog system
 - Replace over 3,000 analog radios use by first responders
- Radio system go-live date end of September
- 911 center full occupancy November
