Thank you for coming to talk with us on November 3, 2021 about Ridwell.

From what you describe, it sounds like Ridwell's services could be a positive addition to Tualatin; our ask of Ridwell is to work collaboratively with the City in order to best serve our residents within the bounds of the City's regulatory system and current franchise agreement.

The City sees a path forward, as outlined below:

- 1. Ridwell needs to be in compliance with Metro Code Chapter 5. This is <u>currently</u> <u>underway</u>, as Ridwell has applied for a Metro solid waste facility license.
- 2. A franchise agreement appears to be the best path forward to doing business in Tualatin. We invite you to reach out to the City to explore options through the City's franchise process. - 3. Ridwell needs to pause accepting signups from any resident or business within the City of Tualatin and to suspend collections for residents already signed up until the above conditions have been met.
