SUBJECT: Purchase Agreement with Champion Homes Center for T-2 Fire Station Temporary Housing

1) Recommended Action:

Authorize the Mayor to sign the purchase agreement with Champion Homes Center for T-2 Fire Station Temporary Housing.

The agreement was recommended for approval by the Public Works Committee at their January 22, 2026 meeting.

2) Background:

With the addition of a full-time medic unit at the T-2 Fire Station starting January 1, 2026, there is no longer adequate space at the station to accommodate staff. This temporary housing solution will provide the necessary space for staff until the completion of the expansion of the station and allow the city to repurpose the structure for other needs or surplus it to recoup funds upon project completion.

3) Policy Support:

Vision, Mission & Values:

Excellence: With excellence, integrity, and efficiency, we deliver timely and responsive City services empowering staff, stewarding public resources, and fostering civic trust.

Providing adequate housing for the Fire Department contributes to the promised timely and responsive City services as well as empowering staff. As things currently stand, Fire Department staff currently use a combination of open-air dorm style bunks and repurposed rooms. With adequate sleep already of concern for this nature of work, providing proper accommodation is essential.
