• Starkville's boys and girls both sit atop our rankings and are both undefeated. Senior Jada Gay is once again one of the best players in the area: she had 30 points and 14 rebounds in Tuesday's win over Tupelo.

Veteran guards Jaden Tate and T.J. Warren headed the boys squad, and they combined for 42 points against Tupelo.

• West Union's boys sure look like a state title contender in 1A. The Eagles are off to a 13-0 start, and all but two of those wins have been by double digits. They average 65.8 points per game.

This is a deeply experienced squad with a great inside-out combo of 6-foot-6 senior Ion Grey Morrisson (17.2 ppg, 10.2 rpg) and junior Carson Conlee (15.2 ppg). And junior Jack Rutherford pitches in 10.2 ppg. West Union faces coun-

ty rival Ingomar tonight. The Eagles won the first meeting, back on Nov. 7, by 19 points.

• Speaking of Ingomar, the Falcons saw a familiar face return this season in Jojo Pety. He transferred to Holly Springs last season but came back home and has picked up where he left off. The senior is averaging 12.5 points per game and has led Ingomar to an 11-4 start. The Falcons could be a factor in 1A -- if they can solve West Union.

• West Point's boys started off 8-0 before suffering their first loss of the season on Tuesday, 57-50 to Houston. The teams previously met on Nov. 4 with West Point winning 62-31, so the Hilltoppers have clearly made some progress (probably helped getting some football players back). So keep an eye on Houston, and specifically keep an eye on 6-4 junior Kase Brooks, who is averaging 18.8 points and 7.5 rebounds. Houston, by the way, is going to play two games

on Saturday: against Ingomar at the Tangle on the Trail in Pontotoc (11 a.m.), and then against Biggersville at the Curtis Loggins Shootout in Calhoun City (2 p.m.). Coach Eddie Neal has a 12-man rotation, which is why he thinks playing two won't be a big problem.

• Well, well, well, if it isn't Drew Tyler winning basketball games. The Oxford boys coach has been doing so for nearly 30 years, and this year's team is off to a 10-0 start. Tyler, who's in his 29th season leading the Chargers, now has 643 career wins.

Oxford has one of the area's most prolific scorers in 5-6 guard Miles Bledsoe, who averages 26.4 points per game. Jack Tatum, a 6-4 guard, averages 15.1 points, while 6-foot guard Jakavion Majors Jr. adds 14 points per game.

ORDINANCE AMENDING DEVELOPMENT CODE CHAPTER 5 - OVERLAY DISTRICTS BY ADDING 5.12 - PARKHILL RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOOD CONSERVATION OVERLAY DISTRICT (TA25-02-01)

Pursuant to the Miss. Code Anno. §21-17-9, in lieu of the full text being printed, the following explanatory statement summarizes the substance of the ordinance. A copy of the full text of the ordinance has been posted (a) on the first floor of City Hall at 71 East Troy Street, Tupelo, Mississippi 38804, (b) the first floor of the Lee County Justice Center at 200 West Jefferson Street, Tupelo, MS 38804, (d) Lee County Library at 219 N. Madison Street, Tupelo, MS 38804. Any resident may request a copy of the full text of the ordinance from City Clerk Kim Hanna on the 2nd floor of City Hall at 71 East Troy St., Tupelo, MS 38804.

SUMMARY

This ordinance amends Chapter 5 - Overlay Districts of the Tupelo Development Code by adding 5.12 - Parkhill Residential Neighborhood Conservation District. The ordinance states the purpose and applicability of the ordinance, use regulations, design standards, construction standards (size, porches, garages, roofs, foundation, exterior finish and fences), review procedures, composition of design review committee, authority of design review committee, permit requirements for construction and renovation and appeals.

The effective date of this Ordinance shall be October 3, 2025.
