RESOLUTION
DESIGNATING THE PAVILION IN CNETRAL PARK WEST
AS THE JAMES TADDY MEMORIAL PAVILION

WHEREAS, the late James Taddy (1945 -2020) grew up and lived his life in Two Rivers; and

WHEREAS, Jim lived a lifetime of service to his community, serving on the Two Rivers City Council for a total of twenty-three years; and

WHEREAS, in addition to his service on City Council, Mr. Taddy was an active volunteer in the community, whether helping out at the Senior Center, driving the transit van for the local hospital, volunteering at his church or working at various community events; and

WHEREAS, Jim Taddy continued to demonstrate his love for Two Rivers even after his passing in the year 2020, as he provided in his estate for generous donations to the City's Fire Department, Police Department, Senior City and to Two Rivers City Government as a whole; totaling well over \$200,000; and

WHEREAS, the City Council on February 15, 2021 directed that Mr. Taddy's donation of \$43,714 to the City be deposited in the Parks and Recreation Capital Projects Fund, to be applied to the "Splash Pad Project," which has since evolved into the Central Park West 365 Project; and

WHEREAS, that Council action was taken “with the understanding that Council will provide further direction in the future regarding project elements to be funded and proper recognition for Mr. Taddy’s bequest;” and

WHEREAS, that first community donation to the Central Park West 365 Project laid the foundation for a successful \$800,000 fund-raising effort that has made that \$1.65 million project a reality—now in the midst of construction for mid-June completion and a mid-July dedication;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Two Rivers hereby recognizes James Taddy's lifetime of leadership and selfless service to our community by designating the pavilion structure at the very heart of Central Park West as the "James Taddy Memorial Pavilion," as an enduring honor to this modest, big-hearted man who so loved Two Rivers; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this designation be commemorated with a memorial plaque, to be placed conspicuously on the pavilion building in his honor.
