THE FIALA STORY

Václav Fiala is an award-winning Czech sculptor whose works have drawn praise and commissions across Europe, Australia, and the United States. Fiala studied art in New York City after the Czechs freed themselves of Soviet oppression in 1989. America became a symbol of freedom and opportunity.



Fiala learned of Matt Konop's Czech-American connection in 2015 at a performance in Klatovy, Czech Republic, of "The Accidental Hero," a one-man show about Col. Matt Konop of Two Rivers written and performed by his grandson, Patrick Dewane. The show tells the amazing story of his grandfather's role in the liberation of Domažlice.

Václav Fiala had been commissioned by the city of Domažlice to create a memorial to the American liberation of the city. He indicated he would be honored to create a monument for Two Rivers.

Fiala used Konop's actual World War II helmet as the model for both the Two Rivers Friendship Table and his monument in Domažlice.

Václav Fiala will be in Two Rivers to participate in the installation of the sculpture and to attend the August 6, 2023, dedication of his Friendship Table.

THE SCULPTURE



"Friendship Table"

A sculpture titled "Friendship Table" by renowned Czech artist Václav Fiala, will be dedicated in Two Rivers' Central Park on Sunday, August 6, 2023. The work will share design elements with Fiala's World War II liberation monument in Two Rivers' Sister City, Domažlice, Czech Republic.

The Two Rivers Friendship Table will be circular with a tree growing through an opening in the middle, a symbol of life and ongoing friendship. On the table top will be the two granite hats signifying two friends – one American, one Czech – sitting at a table for a meal and conversation.

THE SISTER CITIES

The Sister City story began with Matt Konop who was born in Stangelville, WI, but lived most of his adult life in Two Rivers. He is the central character in a story that unites the Two Rivers area with the city of Domažlice in the Czech Republic. Col. Konop was selected to head an advance party of soldiers charged with liberating cities and villages in western Czech Republic in May 1945.

Konop soon recognized that one of the towns being liberated by the American forces was Domažlice, his ancestral home from which his family had emigrated in the 1860's. The local citizens welcomed him and raised him on their shoulders as a hero – one of their own who had returned to liberate them.



Because of the Konop family's historical ties to the Czech area, the city of Domažlice asked the city of Two Rivers to become official Sister Cities in 2017. Adult and student delegations have forged strong friendships with both cities, including six adult and student cultural exchanges.
