Re: Town of Upper Marlboro Charter Review Discussion

#### Commissioners,

Below are some recommendations made by the Charter Review Board that was appointed by the previous Board of Town Commissioners. The members of the Charter Review Board were as follows: Derrick Brooks (Now Town Commissioner), Patti Callicott, Alma Prevatte (Now Town Commissioner) and Payton Wynne.

- Define: Shall, May, Will or Must in the Town of Upper Marlboro Charter
- Unenforceable statements should be removed or clarified to make enforceable.

### Town Elections:

- Who is ultimately responsible for all aspects of elections (need to specify in Town Charter.
- 82-3 Staggered Elections: Full board replacement every 2 years or 3/2 every year. President is voted on election terms (even / odd years)
- Term limits for President (2 terms of 2 years)

### Board of Commissioners Have More Power:

- Commissioners should oversee enclaves within the Town: Police, Public Works; General Government & Town Committees.
- Recall provision: Need to look at verbiage.

### Town Budget:

- 82-43 Cannot move or remove money after budget is approved.
- Monthly spending requires 2 months minimum to be retained in the bank.
- Charter needs to be revised to handle committee spending / proper protocol for spending | budgeted money and resources.

Other notes from minutes of Charter Review Board Meetings:

- 82-16 Do we need to specify items listed?
- 82-27 Fix date.
- 82-33 Remove make gender neutral.
- 82-42 & 43 New section to document changes ordinance in public.
- 82-53 Validate it for today & who's paying it back (Look at 82-56 for verbiage).
- 82-56 Review verbiage.
- 82-57 Taking of minutes Alternative in Town administrative staff who handles long term. (Time to care act).
- 82-60 How do we handle with contacts?
- 82-90 \$600.00 from County.
- 82-88 penalties for violations (not enforceable) add /fix for censure / board decides.
