I have recently been assigned to the position of **Bureau Level Internal Investigations**. While I possess detailed investigative experience, I recognize that Internal Affairs investigations involve specialized techniques, legal considerations, and administrative procedures that differ from standard criminal investigations. To ensure I perform this role with the highest level of professionalism and effectiveness, I respectfully request approval to attend the Internal Affairs **Investigations** training course hosted by the Legal & Liability Risk Management Institute (LLRMI). I have been unable to find any training on this specialized subject matter that is offered with in this LEOS training cycle.

INSTRUCTOR BIOS

Lou Reiter is Co-Director of LLRMI. He has been a national police trainer for the past 39 years primarily instructing on IA/OPS operations, citizen complaints processes, police employee discipline, critical incident investigations and law enforcement civil liability. He has conducted agency audits for departments as small as 3 persons up to 39,000 officers. Lou has acted as a police practices expert in over 1,100 civil trials. His Law Enforcement Administrations Investigations manual was published in its Fourth Edition in 2019. Lou retired from the LAPD after 20 years with the rank of Deputy Chief.

Jack Ryan is an Attorney in Rhode Island, a graduate Juris Doctorate, Cum Laude Suffolk University Law School and has 20 years of law enforcement experience as a police officer with the Providence Police Department, Providence, RI. Jack's law degree and experience as a police officer gives him the unique perspective of public safety legal and liability issues. Jack is a former adjunct faculty member at Salve Regina University and lectures frequently throughout the United States. Jack has written policies and procedures that have been adopted by over 1,000 law enforcement and corrections agencies across the U.S.

Jerry Rodriguez is a retired Captain from the Los Angeles Police Department. He was also Deputy Police Commissioner for the Baltimore Police Department and most recently the Chief of Investigations for the San Francisco District Attorney's Office. He was instrumental in the creation of the LAPD Force Investigation Division in response to the 2001 DOJ Consent Decree. Jerry is currently working as an investigator with the San Luis Obispo County Sheriff's Office.

Stephen Campbell began his law enforcement career with the Providence Rhode Island Police Department which employs 500 sworn officers. He retired after 28 years at the rank of Major, Chief of Detectives. Steve has been a Law Enforcement Trainer and Consultant with the Legal and Liability Risk Management Institute for thirteen years. Steve is a graduate of the Senior Management Institute for Policing at the Police Executive Research Forum (PERF) at Boston University, He holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Administration of Justice from Roger Williams University, Bristol RI and a Master of Science Degree in Administration of Justice from Salve Regina University.

Jeff Carter retired December 2018 as the Deputy Director of the Fayette County Detention Center in Lexington, Kentucky. Over his 20-year career, he has worked all levels of custody inside a 1,300 bed correctional facility located in the horse racing capitol of he world. Jeff was an instructor for 5 years inside the academy where he trained over 700 recruits, molding them into successful leaders in the Corrections field. He presents jail training throughout the country and serves as an Expert Winess around the United States focusing on jail litigation.

Brian Clouse is a 43-veteran of law enforcement with 14 years of experience in school safety and security, leading two major school police departments as their Chief of Police. Brian now provides consultation services to schools, including the provision of school vulnerability assessments and training for school resource officers and school and has been an attorney for 24 years. Brian is a member of the National Association of School Resource Officers.
