Please accept this as the quarterly report for the **Public Works** departments.

Commendable Achievements:

- Numerous employees attended OSHA, and Intermediate Work Zone Safety training.

Project Progress:

- On Jan. 24, 2026 Snowstorm Fern moved into the area, blanketing the area with approximately 12” of snow & sleet. Crews worked through the weekend to make the roads safe for the public. To exacerbate the situation, frigid temperatures moved in with the snow and remained with us for the rest of the week. Crews worked 12 hour shifts to expedite the removal process. Including using equipment to load dump trucks with the snow/ice to be disposed of at the end of Academy Hill Rd. This resulted in approximately 300 loads of frozen precipitation transported for disposal.



- The Christmas tree from beside Town Hall was moved and planted at the Warrenton Aquatic and Recreation Facility.



- The Street crew started the stump removal from Main Street. This is in preparation for the upcoming Main Street Project.



- The Street Crew has been repairing many locations of the sidewalk and asphalt on Falmouth St., Lee St. and Culpeper Street.



- The Street Crew repaired the flood gate at the Warrenton Aquatic and Recreation Facility by the pond. This damage was the result of the 50 year flood that came through the area in July 2025. The new gate is designed to be able to adjust for heavy water flow and will rise, allowing heavy rains to flow out more quickly.



- The Street Crew has repaired many asphalt cuts on Haiti Street. This was the results of the many sites that were repaired by Columbia Gas and Habitat for Humanity. This is in preparation for the repaving of Haiti Street.

- The Land Maintenance Crew in preparation for spring has been cleaning and refreshing the flower beds with mulch. And installing mulch around the trees in the medians. We utilize cedar mulch. It doesn't discolor and deteriorate as quickly and has proven to be more cost-effective and less time-consuming for our employees.



- The Land Maintenance Crew, to assist Parks and Recreation, repaired the perimeter fence by the soccer fields at the Warrenton Aquatic and Recreation Facility. This involved replacing 85 boards and painting.



- The second annual Story with the Director and demo was a success again this year.

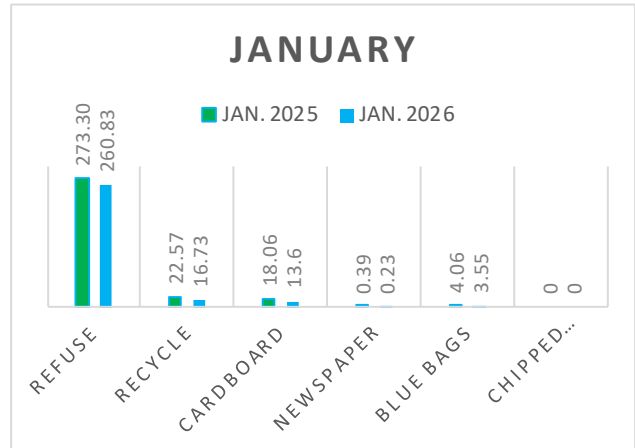

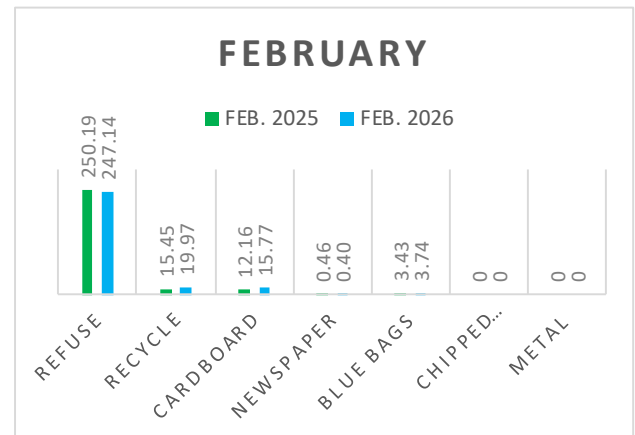
