Areas of Concern:
The first inside gas leak 911 call was dispacted at 1155 and was determined to be an issue with the natural gas service on the HVAC units. As of 1255 the Town of Warrenton atmosphere, businesses, and residences where overcome with a heavy gas odor and multiple 911 calls
received from all over the Town of Warrenton area. This Situation status represents the status of Warrenton lifelines as of March 5, 2025 at 1500. As of 1800hrs 76 911 calls have been received. At 1634 the Town EM hotline was updated with emergency alert message.
VIA and EAS out to public at 1545 "If you smell Gas, Evacuate, Dial 911". Local Declaration of Emergency drafted. Columbia Gas informs EOC that it suspects that the system has been subjected to an excessive dose of mercaptan. Columbia Gas advises that they have activated
all emergency response plans and are dispatching crews to respond to Warrenton. Columbia Gas is anticipating the need to "Flare" off their system. Three flaring trailers are enroute to Warrenton. Columbia Gas engineering is analyzing the best locations. Bridge Canteen
equested to respond to WVFC. Warrenton Police holding over shift and placing additional shift on rapid recall standby. Town Press release went out at 1545. The EOC was transitioned to a Town / County Full EOC activation at 1625, the calls have began to come in as of 1516 hrs
in the County. 1634 the Columbia Gas mobile command center arrives in the Town Hall parking lot. 1st Street is closed to the Public for Emergency Operations. 1636 Joint Town / County PIO message being drafted. 1639 Risk Mgmt. reports facility check complete with no problems
ound. 1710 first flaring site has been established as Fauquier High, 705 Waterloo Road. CG anticipates call volume to decrease when flaring operations start at 1905. 1728 Main street has been re-opened. 1752 EOC reduced down to essential POC's from departements.
