# Quarterly Report Public Works & Utilities Departments

Please accept this as the quarterly report for the **Public Works & Utilities** departments.

### **Commendable Achievements:**

- Numerous employees have completed the Towns Entry Level Drivers Training to obtain their Commercial Drivers Licenses. They have obtained their Class "A" and Class "B" licenses.
- Several employees attended APWA training in Glen Allen, Va., and also FEMA training.

### **Project Progress:**

- A streetlight was struck by a tractor-trailer on Main St. by Town Hall. Employees
  cleared the damage and started working on repairing the foundation for the new
  light to be installed.
- A contest was held to name the Town's snowplows. This was open to all elementary school age children. The winners received a tour of the Public Works Facility and equipment, their pictures with the named plow and a goodie bag.
- The Streets Department took down approximately 12 large trees on Broadview Avenue. From the intersection at Chappel St. to the intersection at WaWa @ 510 Frost Ave. This is part of a larger VDOT project.



• Employees repaired the sidewalk steps on North 3<sup>rd</sup>. Street. This was hazardous from the concrete breaking off, and a mural is scheduled to be painted there.



- Now that the inclement weather season has passed, the Land Maintenance Crew has started weedeating and mowing. They are also cleaning up the gardens and welcome to Warrenton sites from the winter.

### Walkability Study Repairs included:

• Working with a contractor in the Oak Springs Drive area. We are continuing to repair/replace a large section of sidewalk, curb, and gutter replacement. This includes over 30 handicap ramps.





• Removed and replaced a section of sidewalk where the roof drain pipes go through. The section was crumbling and had become a trip hazard to pedestrians.



### **Public Utilities:**


- Staff responded to a water main that had been bored through by a contractor (Team Fishel.) the line had been marked through Miss Utility. The 8" ductile line was repaired.
- We started the annual fire hydrant maintenance schedule. Hydrants are flushed to exercise the internal valves and check operation.
- <u>8</u> Sanitary sewer laterals were repaired.

### **Meter Dept:**

- 0 Meter installed. 0 Meters replaced. 72 Read & Transfer.
- <u>8</u> Water connections issued. <u>7</u> Sewer connections issued.
- 31 Water cut-ons/offs.
- <u>0</u> Meter registers replaced.
- Staff is working on the replacement software for the Department. The current software is outdated and is no longer supported by the vendor.


