Between 4:20-4:30pm on Saturday September 6th, a severe thunderstorm moved across Warrenton, VA. Based on radar data and damage on the ground, a channel of severe, damaging winds moved across northern Warrenton from near St John the Evangelist Church on Winchester St, east to near Walker Dr and Belle Air Ln. The wind downed scattered trees and power poles along that path as the storm tracked east. Peak wind gusts in that channel of damage are estimated around 70-80mph. A *Severe Thunderstorm Warning* was issued by NWS for expected wind damage and hail for Warrenton at 3:58pm.

HAZARD...60 mph wind gusts and quarter size hail.

SOURCE...Radar indicated.

IMPACT...Damaging winds will cause some trees and large branches to fall. This could injure those outdoors, as well as damage homes and vehicles. Roadways may become blocked by downed trees. Localized power outages are possible.

Unsecured light objects may become projectiles.
