Subject: Weed Ordinance Dispute

### Background

201 N. Concord Ave. had three complaints on the property. The first complaint on August 25<sup>th</sup>. It was checked that week and a letter went out on August 29<sup>th</sup>. We then received two additional complaints on September 8<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>. The property was rechecked on September 24<sup>th</sup> at which time it was ordered to mow the property. Another complaint came in on October 2<sup>nd</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>. I reviewed the property and took pictures. There were areas that needed to be mowed again. We mowed the property on October 10<sup>th</sup>.

The property owner and I spoke on October 31<sup>st</sup> about the issues. He no longer lives at the location and has been trying to get the property ready to sell.
