Training and Education

 To uphold the highest standards of public safety, WFA is committed to rigorous training that prepares firefighters for the everchanging challenges of "All Hazards Fire Service." Our firefighters consistently meet all certification and licensing requirements set by local, state, and federal agencies through dedicated coursework and training hours.

Training and Education

- ► In addition to standard Firefighting and Emergency Medical Services, Wheatland Fire Authority personnel are trained in multiple hazard and rescue disciplines. WFA has Firefighters trained in the following:
- Swift Water Rescue Technician Level
- Static Water Rescue- Jet Skis
- Trench Rescue Technician Level
- High Angle Rope Rescue Technician Level
- Rope Rescue Operation Level
- Confined Space Rescue
- Hazardous Materials

Training and Education

- ► All WFA Firefighters are trained in Emergency Medical Services. 10 Firefighters are Emergency Medical Technicians, and the remaining are trained Emergency Medical Responders. WFA EMTs are also trained in Optional Scope Skills. Including:
- Epinephrine Auto Injectors
- Narcan (naloxone) administration
- Blood Glucose Monitoring (Glucometer)
- Advanced Airway Adjuncts (i.e. King Tube, I-Gel)


CODE ENFORCEMENT
