Subject: Consideration and Adoption of Resolution Authorizing Execution of Agreement

with Live Nation Worldwide, Inc. for Supplemental Law Enforcement Services at

Toyota Amphitheatre

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Wheatland City Council conduct a public hearing and consider adoption of a resolution authorizing execution of an agreement with Live Nation Worldwide, Inc., doing business as Toyota Amphitheatre, for the provision of supplemental law enforcement services for concerts and events held at the venue through June 30, 2026.

Discussion: Live Nation Worldwide, Inc. has requested the services of the Wheatland Police Department to provide supplemental law enforcement staffing at concerts and events held at the Toyota Amphitheatre during the 2025-26 fiscal year. Pursuant to Government Code Section 53069.8, the City Council may authorize such services to private entities for special events, provided they do not interfere with the Police Department's regular duties, after discussion at a duly noticed public hearing.

The proposed agreement outlines the terms of service, including staffing levels, reimbursement rates, insurance requirements, and indemnification provisions. The agreement ensures that the City's public safety obligations to its residents are not compromised while allowing the Police Department to support selected and approved large-scale events. Invoices for any services provided will be submitted monthly, and Live Nation is required to remit payment within 30 days of receipt.

Fiscal Impact: There is no negative fiscal impact to the City's General Fund. All personnel costs associated with the provision of supplemental law enforcement services will be reimbursed by Live Nation Worldwide, Inc. at the following hourly rates:

Supervisor (Sergeant): \$108.00/hour
Reserve Sergeant: \$74.00/hour
Police Officer: \$95.00/hour

Reserve Police Officer: \$62.00/hour

The above listed hourly rates exceed the overtime rates paid by the City for these positions.
