



- Residents just a reminder that this is the last week for bagged leaf pick up. Have
 your bags to curb by Thursday night. The last Wednesday for the compost site is
 tomorrow November 19. The compost site will be open on Saturdays until
 December 6, weather permitting. There is also a dumpster located at the city
 garage, 150 E Starin Road, from November 24 to December 5 for residents to
 dispose of yard waste during normal work hours.
- In the Street Department crews have been picking up bagged leaves and street sweeping throughout the city. Staff have been getting ready for winter and the holiday season: reorganization of the DPW shop area for winter operations; moving picnic tables under shelters; preparing Christmas lights; and hanging downtown snowflakes.
- In the Wastewater Department contractors were back on site to work on punch list items on the Vanderlip Pumping Station project. Staff mowed the prairie grass per DNR recommendations to maintain our phosphorus credit and also worked on fixing some outdoor lighting issues. The year end Phosphorus Optimization Report is being prepared for submission.



- Interviews were held for the open dispatcher position. The top candidates are advancing to the background investigation stage of the hiring process.
- Our Communications Center successfully transitioned to ESINet (Emergency Services IP Network) which is the foundation of NexGen911 system. The primary change associated with this is now all cell phone 911 calls in the geographic boundaries of the City of Whitewater will be routed to our Communications Center rather than one of the county communications centers.
- WPD hosted interviews for our Detective Lieutenant hiring process. Command staff, HR as well as a PFC representative were on the interview panel.
- Recently, WPD enjoyed spending time with some of our local community members during Coffee with a Cop at Jessica's.



- Ambulance 1282 was taken out of service due to mechanical issues. While
 operating with only 2 Ambulances, MABAS request will result in a Pass and
 Mutual Aid provided to Fort and Lagrange will be limited to critical calls for
 service only. Both Fort and Lagrange offered assistance if needed while our
 apparatus was out of service.
- On Thursday, November 6th-

at 10:47 AM Whitewater responded to a barn fire in the town of Lima.

at 11:05 AM while crews were working at the barn fire an EMS call for service was dispatched and covered by a Janesville ambulance that was responding to the barn fire.

Another EMS call for service was dispatched at 11:51 AM and was covered by Lake Geneva while they were assigned to change of quarters.

At 1:35 PM Whitewater responded back to the barn fire for a rekindle. Lagrange responded with a Chief and their Engine was cancelled while enroute.

 Sunday, November 9th Whitewater responded to a shed fire in the town of Whitewater. Lagrange and Darian provided Auto Aid for the incident Sunday, November 9th a motor vehicle accident was dispatched while crews were working at the shed fire. Mutual Aid was received from Lakeside and Fort Atkinson for the incident.

- Engine 1222 was taken out of service due to needed repairs being done at Fire Services Inc in Lake Mills. MABAS or Mutual Aid request for an Engine will result in a Pass until it's back in service.
- Ambulance 1282, was again taken out of service due to mechanical issues. While
 operating with only 2 Ambulances, MABAS request will result in a Pass and
 Mutual Aid provided to Fort and Lagrange will be limited to critical calls for
 service only.
- Engine 1222 was put back in service following the completion of repairs. All units

10/2-8

Staff responded to 54 calls for service, making the daily average of 7.7 calls for service each day.

5 calls for service required POC response. Average POC response for All Calls was 1.0 per call.

Mutual Aid was requested twice from Whitewater during this time, and we did not request Mutual Aid.

10/9-14

Staff responded to 33 calls for service, making the daily average of 5.5 calls for service each day.

3 calls for service required POC response. Average POC response for All Calls was 2.0 per call.

Mutual Aid was not requested from Whitewater during this time, and we did not request Mutual Aid.

10/15-22

Staff responded to 46 calls for service, making the daily average of 5.75 calls for service each day.

7 calls for service required POC response. Average POC response for All Calls was 1.28 per call.

Mutual Aid was requested 3 times (canceled once) from Whitewater during this time, and we requested Mutual Aid/Auto Aid twice (canceled once).

10/23-29

Staff responded to 47 calls for service, making the daily average of 6.7 calls for service each day.

7calls for service required POC response. Average POC response for All Calls was 1.0 per call.

Mutual Aid was requested twice from Whitewater during this time, and we did not request Mutual Aid.

Monday, November 10th and Wednesday, November 12th interviews were conducted for the 3 new positions from the referendum.


AC Dion attended the PARC for an update of the training facility project and stopped by the Community Foundation meeting following.

- The Business Retention and Expansion (BRE) program resumed this week. These visits are being conducted by the Economic Development Director and the Whitewater Area Chamber of Commerce's Executive Director, Karin Silvius. (Kurrrin Sill-vee-us) The first visit was with Fort Healthcare on November 12th to discuss their Whitewater clinic and future needs. The team met with Jim Nelson and Tiffany Pernat (Purr-nat) of Fort Healthcare (see picture above). A visit to Generac's Whitewater facility is scheduled for the near future.
- Work continues on revising the proposed Home Renewal Program, which will be reviewed by the CDA on November 20th and will return to the Common Council for final approval in December. The new Economic Development Coordinator, Ashwini Rao, (Ash-Winnie Rarr-o) will be administering this program, with assistance from Thrive ED. This program will help revitalize existing single-family housing stock in the community, as well as allow for the reconversion of multifamily units back into single-family owner-occupied housing.
- The Downpayment Assistance Program continues to generate strong interest, with two new applications up for review by the CDA on November 20th. This

program is successfully helping homebuyers move into owner-occupied housing here in the City of Whitewater, and is made possible with assistance from our local banks and credit unions who work with homebuyers to verify their eligibility for this assistance.



- Adamantine Spine Movers spent six days at the library bringing back the items
 they stored off site, building bookshelves, placing books on the shelves, and
 putting together staff workstations. We were very pleased with the service we
 received from them.
- Curbside service resumed on Monday, November 10. Our patrons were pleased to be able to once again place holds online and pick them up and the library. The library will open completely on December 8.
- The city inspector and fire inspector did a final walk through at the library on November 11, checking that everything was working correctly and up to code.
 The new front entrance door is now programmed to automatically lock and unlock according to a set schedule.


The cleaning company hired by Miron Construction will be here on Friday,


 Get Out And Enjoy The Parks: Take a Breath, Take a Stroll — Fall in Love with Whitewater's Colors

Many applicants have shared positive impressions of the Whitewater Fire & EMS Department, expressed strong interest in the training facility, and noted their appreciation for the recruitment video.

Training


On November 6, 2025, sixty-six employees buckled up for mandatory Defensive


