- Eyeglass and hearing aid assistance (Courtesy of the Lions Club)

January–July Service Comparison (2024 vs. 2025)

- Between January and July 2025, Wilsonville Community Sharing experienced a marked increase in both individual and family services compared to the same period in 2024:
 - Individuals served rose from 2,311 in 2024 to 2,982 in 2025 — a 29% increase.
 - Families served increased from 857 to 1,151 — a 34.3% rise.

Summary

- Increase YTD of 13% for Direct service
- Increase YTD of 17% in families utilizing the food bank
- Statistically, our numbers of those served have remained consistent with the growth of the Wilsonville community. We have found that families tend to move out to more affordable communities and therefore our client base is fluid.

2025 Highlights

- WCS received the Community Enhancement Grant in July 2025 \$11,350.
 - This grant will assist in moving and furnishing the new location.
- WCS is a subrecipient of the Supportive Housing Services Grant through Clackamas county,
 - Leigh Crosby is serving as the project administrator along with Amanda Guile- Hinman, Zoe Mombert and the Heart of the City.
 - This grant can provide: car repairs, hotel vouchers, Goodwill and Gas card to assist current homeless individual/families with needs in these areas.

2026 Goals

- Moving to our new dedicated space hopefully April 2026.
- Updating our website and increasing our social media presence.
- The Board will plan and execute a media based outreach targeting local businesses in hopes of increasing donations and general awareness; this will educate the Wilsonville residents on what we provide and what we do for the community.
