Long distance migrations/large home range

Multigenerational migrations

Seasonal migrations

Daily movements

Habitat Connectivity is essential for the long-term survival of species



Local Scale: Wilsonville is Taking Action to Protect Habitat Connectivity

Preserving greenways and natural areas

Protecting riparian corridors

Including Wildlife Crossing Structures in roadways design



Boeckman Road Wildlife Crossings

Monitoring: 2009-2023

Documented 24 species of mammal, amphibian, and reptile. Measured wildlife activity with over 13,000 individual tracks







Kinsman Road Wildlife Crossings

Pre-construction data: Oct 2015 to June 2016.

Post-construction: Sept 2018 - 2024

Documented nearly 10,000 (9,883) wildlife observations during this time





Documented: 465 instances of wildlife activity from at least 8 different species



Documented: 303 instances of wildlife activity from at least 14 different species



CWC - Boeckman Creek Trail

Documented: 600 instances of wildlife activity from at least 12 different species

Documented: 339 instances of wildlife activity from at least 11 different species





CWC -Boeckman Creek Primary School

Documented: 466 instances of wildlife activity from at least 7 different species

Documented: 622 instances of wildlife activity from at least 11 different species
