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## **ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL:**

A supplemental budget resolution for the FY 2022-23 budget year.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

Oregon's Local Budget Law allows the Council to amend the adopted budget for an occurrence or condition that was not known at the time the budget was adopted. A special hearing must be held to discuss and adopt the supplemental budget. The governing body holds the public hearing although the budget committee is not required to be involved. Public notice of the hearing must be published 5 to 30 days before the hearing. The governing body enacts a resolution to adopt the supplemental budget after the hearing.

This supplemental budget includes:

#### (1) CIP Rollovers:

The re-appropriation of funds from the prior fiscal year for capital projects (CIPs) that were started but not completed in that fiscal year. The CIP rollover request of \$6,079,890 includes \$5,698,660 of direct costs and \$381,230 of overhead costs, as detailed in Attachment 1.

- (2) <u>New Requests</u>: Unanticipated changes to budget appropriations, of \$1,524,608, include:
  - a. Planning Department: Additional *Professional Services* budget for assist with statutory requirements/plan and permit applications \$50,000
  - Parks Maintenance/Parks & Recreation: Transfer vacant Admin Assistant, full time employee (FTE), position in Parks & Recreation to recast and fill as an additional Lead Position for Parks Maintenance – Net increase \$16,000
  - c. Facilities Capital Improvements: CIP 0997 (Ice Machine Damage) \$36,132
  - d. Fleet: Additional budget for vehicle purchase due to market increases \$7,000
  - e. Parks Capital Improvements:
    - CIP 9167 (Villebois Parks) \$195,840
    - CIP 9174 (ADA Improvements to River Fox Park) \$90,000
    - CIP 9175 (Frog Pond West Neighborhood Park) \$200,000
    - CIP 9179 (Emerald Ash Bore Mitigation) \$45,000
  - f. Roads Capital Improvement:
    - CIP 3001 (Frog Pond Master Planning (East/South) \$84,399
    - CIP 4196 (5<sup>th</sup> St/Kinsman Railroad Reconstruction) \$560,000
  - g. Water Treatment Plant:
    - Pumping System Modification for Standby Generator \$166,237; plus a related capital equipment rollover of \$170,738 from prior year.
  - h. Sewer:
    - CIP 2100 (Boberg Diversion Structure) \$17,000
    - CIP 2104 (Wastewater Treatment Plant Master Plan) \$37,000
    - Capital equipment rollover of \$82,100 from prior year
  - i. Stormwater:
    - CIP 7062 (95<sup>th</sup> Avenue Storm Pipe Repairs) \$20,000

(3) Adjustments to budgeted beginning working capital and/or transfers in the Road Ops, Water Ops, Sewer Ops, Storm Ops, and General Funds related to consolidating Public Works Complex loan proceeds into the Facilities CIP for streamlined funding of the project.

#### **EXPECTED RESULTS:**

The supplemental budget adjustment adopted by the Council at regularly scheduled meeting.

#### **TIMELINE:**

As required by Local Budget Law, a notice for the public hearing has been published in the Wilsonville Spokesman on October 5, 2022 and October 12, 2022. The adoption of the Supplemental Budget Adjustment is required prior to the end of the fiscal year, June 30, 2023.

#### **CURRENT YEAR BUDGET IMPACTS:**

See detail outlined in Exhibit A.

#### **COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT PROCESS:**

The public hearing will be held on October 17, 2022 as a part of the adoption process.

#### POTENTIAL IMPACTS OR BENEFIT TO THE COMMUNITY:

The amended budget provides for the delivery of services and construction of capital projects throughout the community.

#### **ALTERNATIVES:**

Not approving the attached supplemental budget could result in overspending current budget appropriations. The City is required to disclose all excess of expenditures over appropriations in the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR).
