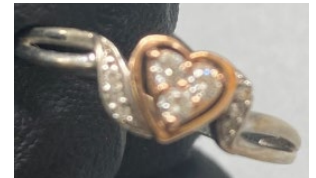


Wilsonville Police and the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office are actively investigating the disappearance of Kathryn Gerke, a Wilsonville resident last seen in the Villebois area on March 26.

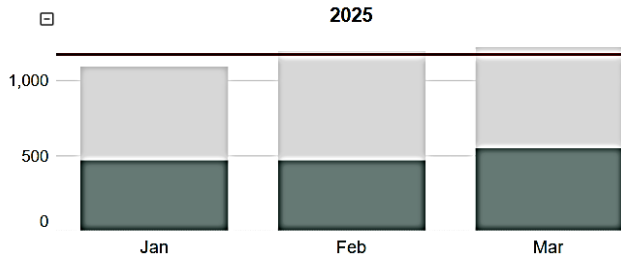

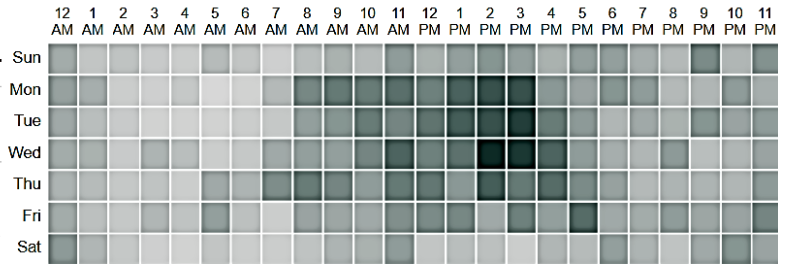
