Delivered on Wilsonville's Top Priorities

→ Recreational Liability

- ◆ **Compromise amendment to [SB 1517](#) passed.** Liability waivers will be more enforceable and insurance will be more available (cheaper) for sport, fitness, and recreational entities.

→ Public Meetings Laws

- ◆ **Oregon Government Ethics Commission Work Group Policies passed:** Local Government member ([HB 4159](#)). Food & beverages given to public officials ([HB4161](#)). Serial communications statute clarity ([HB 4177](#)).

→ Housing Needs and Local Control

- ◆ **LOCAL Act (HB4148)** lets cities manage more of their TLT dollars and better serve local needs
- ◆ **Disability Accessible Housing ([SB1576](#))**
- ◆ **My NO votes in housing ([HB4037](#), [HB2658](#), [SB974](#), [HB2258](#), etc)** Reflect my support for smart planning and for cities to have control over development according to local housing needs.

Invested in Wilsonville's Top Priorities

→ Boone Bridge Funding

- ◆ **\$1 million** – successfully defended the 2025 investment. Continuing to partner with Congresswoman Salinas and Mayor O'Neil to keep moving this project forward.

→ Washington County Courthouse Replacement Project

- ◆ **\$1.25 million** – successfully defended the 2025 investment.

→ Industrial Site Readiness

- ◆ **\$10 million** investment in the fund which is a critical economic development tool. ([HB 5204](#)).

→ Child Care

- ◆ **\$67 million** to Stabilized Employment Related Child Care (ERDC).

→ Housing

- ◆ **\$100 million** to create and preserve affordable housing (SB5702 & HB4036).

Passed Policies that Protect Oregon

→ Expanded EITC and Balanced Oregon's Budget

- ◆ Increased Earned Income Tax Credit for 200,000 Oregon Families
- ◆ SB1507 Responded to HR1 impacts, and disconnected from the most harmful components to preserve \$311 million
- ◆ Protected core services including health care, natural resources, and public safety.

→ Pushed Back against Federal Overreach with a robust immigrant justice package

- ◆ HB 4079, HB 4114, HB 4138, and SB 1570: are among the many important bills that strengthen protections against unlawful immigration enforcement in homes, protect privacy and safety in hospitals and schools, and provide support to respond to ICE activities in our communities.

→ Invested in Wildlife Conservation

- ◆ HB4134 Dedicates funding to protect Oregon's natural resources and wildlife conservation through 1.25% TLT increase.

Delivered for for Oregon 2026

→ We Protected Reproductive Healthcare Patients and Providers:

- ◆ **HB 4088** upholds patients and providers rights in Oregon (when they seek or provide already legal reproductive or gender-affirming healthcare in Oregon) from legal attacks originating out of state.

→ We Closed a Predatory Lending Loophole:

- ◆ **HB 4116** reaffirms Oregon's longstanding 36% ceiling on consumer loans. Out-of-state digital loan sharks will no longer be able to prey on vulnerable customers with triple-digit interest rates.

→ We Established Oregon's Battery Producer Responsibility Program:

- ◆ **HB 4144** will reduce costly fires in our landfills, protect human health, and improve materials recovery by requiring battery manufacturers selling in Oregon to be responsible for collecting and recycling used batteries.

Delivered for Oregon 2026 (cont)

→ We Put Oregon Homebuyers Before Billionaires:

- ◆ **HB 4128** ensures that Oregonians will not be competing with Wall Street to buy a home. Makes private equity firms wait 90 days for local buyers to make first offers when homes come on the market.

→ We Stabilized Animal Rescues:

- ◆ **HB 4034** fixes oversight structures for animal rescue entities and allows more resources to go directly to animal welfare.

→ We Strengthened Wage Theft Protections:

- ◆ **HB 4089** cracks down on wage theft by bad actors who see penalties as simply a cost of doing business. It establishes targeted criminal accountability for contractors who knowingly work w/ unlicensed labor brokers.

Ongoing Policy Work

→ Education

- ◆ **Postsecondary Attainment Steering Committee** with Higher Education Coordinating Commission.
- ◆ **School Meals and Nutrition** support healthy development, social interactions, learning outcomes.
- ◆ **Statewide Educator Salary Task Force** our recommendations need to be revisited.

→ Environment

- ◆ **Co-Vice Chair of Environmental Caucus** – Clean energy and economic strategy go hand in hand. I am interested in Virtual Power Plants (VPP), Inclusive Utility Investments (IUI), and more.
- ◆ **Food Waste, Pollution, Toxins in Water and Land** – Environmental health impacts everyone.
- ◆ **Task Force For Municipal Solid Waste in the Willamette Valley** – Seeking landfill solutions including preparation for Coffin Butte Landfill closure.

→ Transportation

- ◆ **Defending 50/30/20 and supporting a 2027 package** to include multimodal solutions, seismic improvements, rail, transit access, and EV infrastructure.
