# Public Outreach



- *Let's Talk Wilsonville* Questionnaire
  - 221 Responses
- HOA Outreach
  - 181 Responses
- RV Owner Outreach
  - 9 Responses

# Information Gathered (LTW)

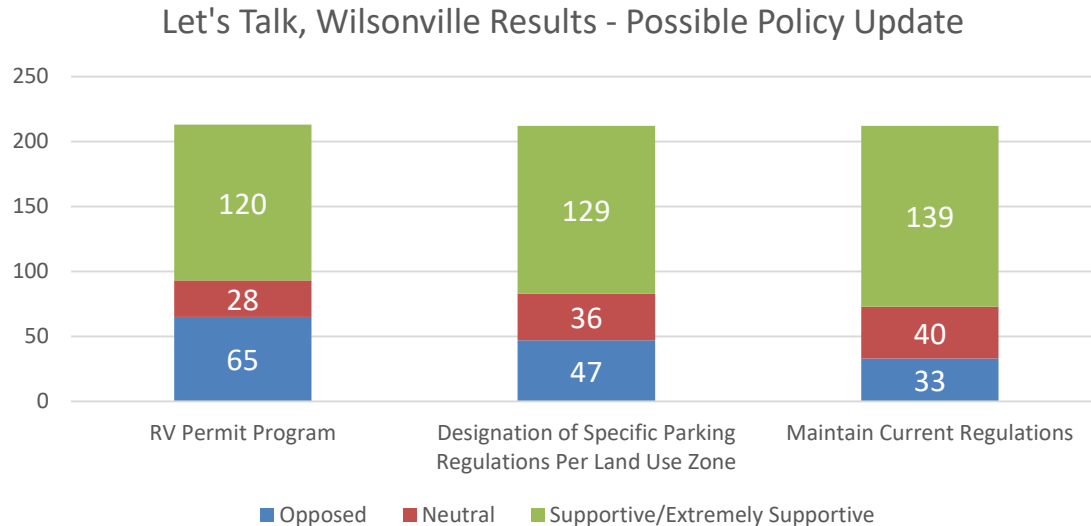


- Most Respondents (95.5%) Are Residents
- 86% Identified as Living in a Single-Family Residence
- Top Considerations Identified for Parking Regulations:
  - Livability
  - Safety
  - Enforcement Capabilities

# Information Gathered (LTW)



- Considered: RV Permit Program, Specific Parking Regulations Based on Zone, or Current Regulations



# Information Gathering (cont)



- HOAs:
  - RV Parking in Neighborhoods Not a Significant Concern
    - Typically, HOAs Have Stricter Regulations
- RV Owners/Possessors:
  - Concern about Possible Permits
  - Concern on Number of Permits/Year



# Potential Updates



- Hourly Limits for Different Zones:
  - Consider Alternative of 48 Hours (or Other Standardized Time Limit)
- RV Permit Program:
  - Consider Higher Number of Permits/Year
  - Pilot Program
