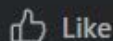


**Does anyone know why the city hasn't invested in Red light Cameras and/or visible "do not block intersection" signs on Wilsonville Rd?**

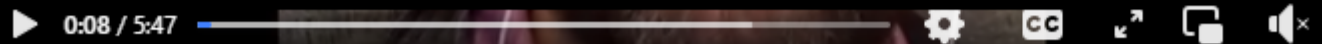
