# DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

A pattern of behaviors used by one partner to maintain power and control over another in an intimate relationship.

Abuse can be emotional, physical, sexual, economic or spiritual and can occur in different relationships between spouses, two people living together, other family members or caretakers.

More than 16 million people suffer from intimate partner abuse each year.

Every minute 32 people experience intimate partner violence.

Everyone deserves to have a healthy, loving and respectful relationship-no matter what.



### **Since 2013**

- 7,164 survivors accessed services at the center for the first time
- 35,479 total visits for services
- 4,710 protective orders
- 22% referred by law enforcement
- 17% referred by family or friend

Support law enforcement efforts to apprehend and prosecute offenders of family violence.






