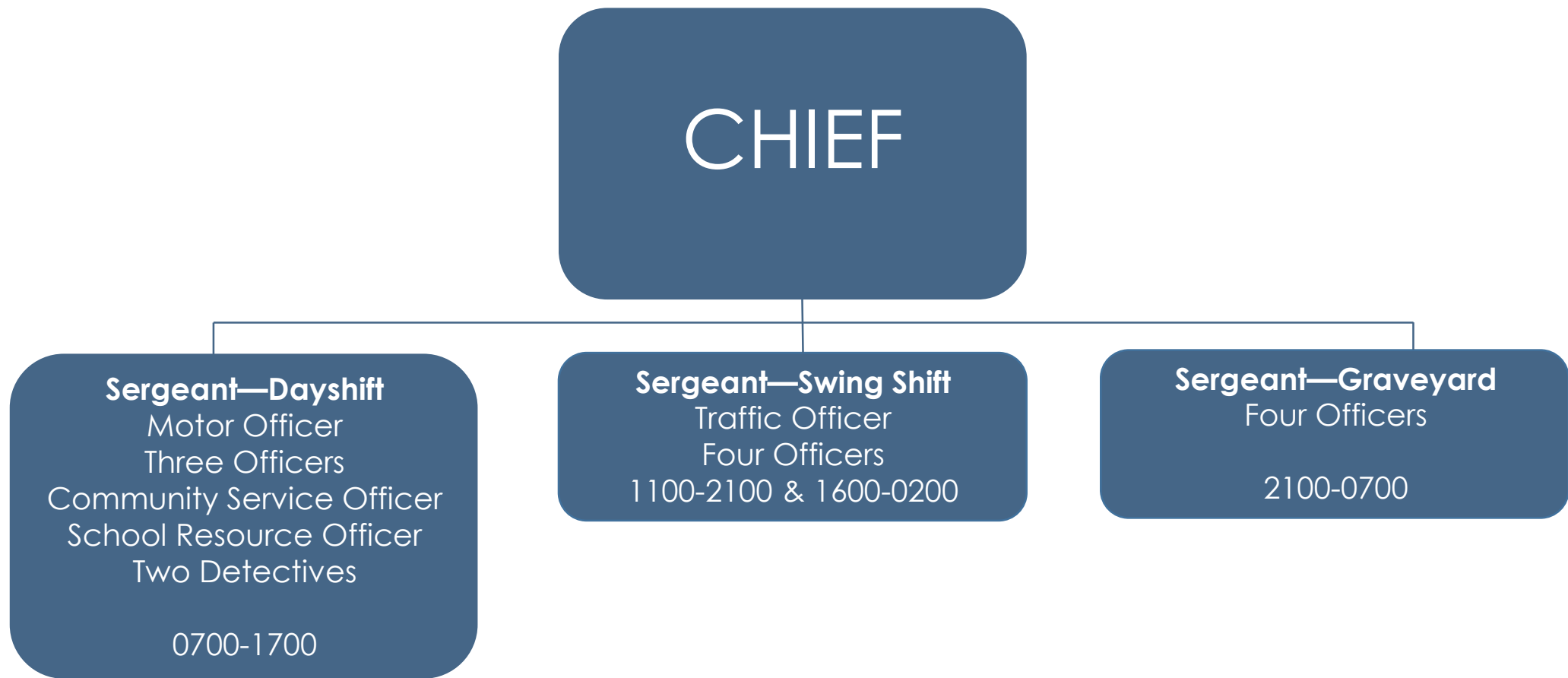

The Four Ds of Crime Prevention

- **Deny**—Entry or the opportunity for crime to occur
- **Delay**—Entry and heighten awareness
- **Detect**—Unlawful entry via devices
- **Deter**—Criminals from committing a crime



Car Break-in Prevention

- If at all possible, keep your car in a closed, locked garage
- Keep the parking area well lit with motion lights
- Don't leave ANYTHING of value in the car!

The Tweedle story: We inventoried/photographed more than 1,084 articles, identified more than 100 victims, and were able to track down a fraction of those people to return property (lead case 18-028834)
