

Administration July 2026 Report

The Administration Department supports the City Manager, City Council, and three committees. The department also includes communications, government affairs and records among many special projects. This report is intended to provide the City Council with monthly highlights that they may not receive otherwise.

- **City Recorder** received 24 public records request in July, of which only four (4) were from Wilsonville Residents.
- **Code Compliance:** Received 16 complaints from the “Ask the City” customer relationship management (CRM). Common complaints were regarding abandoned vehicles and noxious vegetation.
 - Citations were issued for solicitation, off leash law and noxious vegetation.
- **Committees:**
 - Wilsonville’s Diversity Equity and Inclusion (DEI) Committee did not meet in July. The DEI Las Posadas and Pride subcommittees met to discuss their 2026 events.
 - Wilsonville-Metro Community Enhancement Committee and the Tourism Promotion Committee did not meet in July.
- **Communications:** The City published the 2025 -2026 Annual Report which was sent to every household in Wilsonville.
 - Most views on Facebook in July – “It’s official, Wilsonville has a brand new park!” – Frog Pond Park Announcement on July 29. (Image above)
 - Compared to May 30 - June 30, there was a **220.6% increase** in followers on Facebook, the City reached the highest number of followers on July 15.
 - Compared to May 30 - June 30, there was a **278% increase** in followers on Instagram, the City reached the highest number of followers on July 15.
- **Public Affairs:** Congresswoman Andrea Salinas, State Senator Courtney Neron-Misslin, Representative Sue Rieke-Smith, and Mayor Shawn O’Neil toured geotechnical drilling at Boone Bridge on July 30.
- **Volunteers:** City Volunteers were invited to attend a volunteer appreciation event at the upcoming Party in the Park event on August 20, 2026, at 5:30pm.
