### **STARS Camp**

The annual STARS Camp took place June 16 -18! ### Temporary Pride Month Mural at Parks & Rec Admin

Previously at the April Arts, Culture and Heritage Committee (ACHC) meeting, the Commission selected Daren Todd and his design for this year's temporary pride mural to be installed for the month of June. Daren enjoys "funky abstract designs" and "making larger than-life sized artworks and installations designed to inspire." He has recently completed work for the Portland Trail Blazers and the Portland Streetcar. His unique design for Wilsonville Pride is called "Celebrating In Every Color "and it expresses a vibrant and joyful celebration of queer love, identity and community. The mural is inspired by the Progress Pride Flag and is designed with a rainbow gradient from left to right. Monochromatic hues make up each of the seven panels, a nod to the visual spectrum depicted in the illustrations that honors the full diversity of the LGBTQIA+ community. The design allows for light to come into the building and also invites people to pause, reflect and celebrate Pride in all its forms. The purpose and goal of the mural is to provide visual representation to uplift, recognize and celebrate the LGBTQIA+ community and celebrate and honor Pride Month which was achieved by Daren's thoughtful design.

#### **Skateboard Lessons**

In partnership with the Wilsonville Skate park Association, free skateboard lessons were offered this month. 22 young community members had the opportunity to learn the basics of skateboarding during three sessions taught by volunteer coaches.







### Korean War Remembrance Ceremony

Nearly 300 individuals were in attendance on Saturday, June 29 at Town Center Park for a ceremony remembering the 75th Anniversary of the Outbreak of the Korean War. Speeches were made by Mayor O'Neil, The Honorable Eunji Seo, Consul General, Consulate General of the Republic of Korea in Seattle, Francesca Kim, President, Korean Society of Oregon and Dr. Nakeia Daniels, Director of Oregon Department of Veterans Affairs (ODVA). Veterans were recognized throughout the event, seven memorial wreaths were placed and taps were played at the culmination to honor those who were lost.
