ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL:

Does the City Council wish to submit one or more of Draft 2023 Legislative Concepts that advance City Council Goals for consideration by Wilsonville's state legislators for potential introduction as legislation for the 2023 session of the Oregon Legislative Assembly?

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Wilsonville-area Representative Courtney Neron of House District 26 has indicated a willingness to consider City's 2023 Legislative Concepts for submission to Legislative Counsel for crafting into potential legislation. Rep. Neron, who is allotted up to four (4) bills to introduce by the Sept. 23 deadline, has indicated that she seeks a written request from City Council for any legislation that her office would consider for introduction.

Attachment 1 reviews in detail the Draft 2023 Legislative Concepts:

These legislative concepts have been shared with relevant agencies ODOT and TriMet and with Rep. Neron in advance of City Council consideration. The Aurora State Airport legislative concepts have been developed in conjunction with City partners, including representatives of the City of Aurora and Planning Commission Chair Joseph Schaefer, Friends of French Prairie and 1000 Friends of Oregon. The Authorization/Appropriation Request for the RSIS program has been prepared in consultation with representatives of the Oregon Economic Development Association (OEDA) and Oregon Business Counsel.

EXPECTED RESULTS:

Introduction and successful passage of legislation supporting the Draft 2023 Legislative Concepts would advance key City Council Goals.

TIMELINE:

Legislative Concepts from state legislators are due for submission to Legislative Counsel by Sept. 23, 2022, for introduction in the 2023 legislative session that starts on Jan. 17, 2023.

CURRENT YEAR BUDGET IMPACTS:

No impacts beyond budgeted funds anticipated.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT PROCESS:

The City Council's Goals and Legislative Agenda are the products of considerable public engagement over time resulting from the development of City master plans and strategies.

POTENTIAL IMPACTS OR BENEFIT TO THE COMMUNITY:

Successful passage of legislation could result in improved intergovernmental coordination and planning for the Aurora State Airport, enhanced public transit services for the South Metro and North Willamette Valley regions, and potential increased state funding support for City's prospective industrial development.
