ISSUE BEFORE COMMISSION:

The seven adopted goals for the transportation system and performance monitoring reporting.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Wilsonville's Transportation System Plan (TSP) provides policies, standards, projects and programs that are intended to improve the City's transportation system when implemented. The City monitors and reports on key performance measure that were included in the TSP every three years. The City contracted with the City's Traffic Consultant, DKS Associates, to provide an update to the 2023 Transportation Performance Report, using data from 2023 to 2026.

There are seven adopted goals for the transportation system: safety; connectivity and accessibility; functionality and reliability; cost effectiveness; compatibility; robust; and promotes livability. The 2026 Performance Report will provide a progress report for each measure except cost effectiveness and compatibility.

The City is required to update its TSP by June 30, 2029 to incorporate Climate-Friendly and Equitable Communities (CFEC) program. It is anticipated that the updated TSP will require more frequent performance tracking in the future.

EXPECTED RESULTS:

Tracking the performance measures on a regular basis, through updated performance monitoring reports, allows the City to understand the benefits of private and public investments in our transportation system.

TIMELINE:

The Performance Monitoring Report was last updated in 2023. The City updates the Performance Monitoring Report every three years.

CURRENT YEAR BUDGET IMPACTS:

The total cost of this report is \$62,000.00. The cost has been budgeted for and split between fiscal year (FY) 2025-26 and FY 2026-27.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT PROCESS:

The final report will be presented to Council October 5, 2026 and posted to the website.

POTENTIAL IMPACTS OR BENEFIT TO THE COMMUNITY:

Review the progress toward meeting the performance measures adopted in the Transportation System Plan every three years helps to assure private and public improvements are continuing to meet the City's adopted transportation goals.
