# Project Objectives

- Convert the 80+ oral history interviews recorded on VHS & Hi-8 video cassette to digital format
- Create learning opportunities from the video content
- ☼ Merge the previous photo digitization grant project (CEP 2020-2022) with this oral history project
- ☼ Make bound copies of the video transcripts so they are accessible for research
- Extract stories and highlights from the printed transcripts to create historical vignettes
- Develop the vignettes into a fun, educational resource that introduces our community's youth to Wilsonville's Significant Citizens & our Community's History
- Develop a plan to partner with the City of Wilsonville and local schools for educational use of this resource
- ☼ Broadcast oral histories on cable network with Willamette Falls Media Center and City of Wilsonville
- ☼ Provide stories to the Boones Ferry Messenger and The Spokesman

# Digitizing the Videos

- ❖ Worked with Willamette Falls Media Center
- Converted over 80 VHS interviews, 46 Hi-8 cassettes and
   10 audio cassette tapes to digital format.
- Created several copies of this digital archive to be stored in different locations, including:

  - Private YouTube Channel










Approx 1890's −\_ Hops drying & Bailing Barn

#### MAIN STREET

It was always a special treat to visit the main street of Wilsonville.

People would be outside visiting on the wooden sidewalks in front of the stores or in front of the tavern. We seemed to always bump into a neighbor when we went to collect the mail.

The population of Wilsonville stayed between 300-500 people for most of my childhood, this included the farmers at the edges of town. It was one of the smallest populations compared to all the other towns in Clackamas County.


