**4A. MAYOR'S BUSINESS – Introduction**

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Good evening everyone. We have a full agenda tonight and also have the graduation ceremony for our Civics Academy participants so I will keep my verbal report short; my full Business Meeting will be posted online for the public.

## 4B. MAYOR'S BUSINESS – Recent Meetings, Events, Etc.

### Farmer's Market and Rotary Concert (July 23 and July 30)

The **Rotary Summer Concert Series** has been in full swing with concerts on July 23<sup>rd</sup> and July 30<sup>th</sup>. The final concert in the series will be this **Thursday, August 6<sup>th</sup> at 5:30pm in Town Center Park**, featuring Band After Midnight, an ABBA tribute band. The **Wilsonville Farmer's Market** will be taking place alongside the concert to serenade while you shop!

### LCDC MOHR Testimony (July 29)

At the request of the **League of Oregon Cities**, I testified **in opposition to proposed rules** before **Land Conservation and Development Commission**.

The proposed rules are intended to speed housing production, particularly for infill development, but have been widely **panned by both local governments and developers** as impractical to implement, ineffective in achieving their stated goal, and written in a way that does not consider the unique needs and conditions of cities across Oregon—such as a home at the coast facing different natural disaster risks than a home in central Oregon.

One example of how the rules do not represent the on-the-ground reality that cities face is that garage setbacks in the proposed rules do not accommodate the full length of many larger vehicles, which could

leave shorter driveways with vehicles hanging out over the sidewalk. While LCDC is required to adopt rules for this program, which was created by the State Legislature, there is vast room for improvement.

### **Boone Bridge Geotech Visit with Congresswoman Salinas (July 30)**

I was honored to accompany **Congresswoman Andrea Salinas** on a visit to the **Boone Bridge** last **Thursday, July 30<sup>th</sup>**. ODOT is conducting a **geotechnical investigation** into the soil types found at and near the bridge, which is a crucial step toward planning a new bridge. There is still a long, long road ahead for a new, wider, seismically resilient Boone Bridge, but it was great to see drills in the ground doing exploratory work.

ODOT's contractor was doing work on the south side of the bridge, so Congresswoman Salinas and I hiked down to the base of the bridge to learn from ODOT staff and the contractor about their work. After that, the Congresswoman and I were joined by State Senator Courtney Neron Misslin and State Representative Sue Rieke Smith on the north side of the bridge, where the Congresswoman held a press briefing to share what she had learned.

An earmark request for several million to continue the preliminary work is still in progress at the federal level, and Congresswoman Salinas has been a great advocate for that funding request and the project generally, including mentioning its need and value to interstate commerce during a House Transportation and Infrastructure

Committee hearing several months ago. Many thanks to her, her team, and our state legislators for coming together to showcase our unified support.

##### **National Night Out (August 4)**

**National Night Out** is a national public safety initiative developed to build trust among local emergency responders and the communities they serve. On the **first Tuesday in August** from **5:00 PM to 9:00 PM**, millions take part in National Night Out events in all 50 states plus U.S. territories and military bases worldwide.

Neighborhoods host block parties, festivals, parades, and other community-building gatherings. Every year, representatives from the **Wilsonville Police Department** and **Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue** visit neighborhood gatherings to mingle and make our city a more connected and caring place to live. I look forward to visiting the National Night Out festivities with City Manager Jeanna Troha and Police Chief Jed Wilson.
