FYB League Summary

- **Spring League (March 1 – June 10)**
Served **1,032 players** (ages 4–12) across two leagues:
 - **Draft League:** 24 teams, 280 players
 - **Open League:** 70 teams, 752 players
 - Spring league was successful and will continue next year.
 - **Summer League**
No summer league held in 2025. Instead, additional tournaments were added in August and September.
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FYB Tournaments

- Hosted **9 weekend tournaments** (March–October) in **Wolfforth and Lubbock** for ages 7–14.
- **7 of 9 tournaments** have been completed; one (State Warm-Up) was rained out.
- **Over 650 teams** from West Texas and New Mexico participated or are registered.

Summary: Strong tournament turnout benefiting the cities of Lubbock and Wolfforth with local and travel teams; will continue March–October tournaments next year.

Field Improvements

- **Upgrades Made:**

- Rye overseeding last fall; next overseeding planned for October, 2025
- New sod installed on Fields 4 & 5 infields last year
- Improved irrigation and sprinkler maintenance (in partnership with Henry High)
- Consistent watering and good rainfall improved field conditions
- Added additional dirt to infields to level them out

Field Summary: Ongoing investment in field quality is paying off; condition improvements have been well-received.

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Proposed Capital Improvements

FYB respectfully requests city support for the following upgrades:

Improvement	Purpose/Notes
LED Field Lights	Long-term energy efficiency; city plans already in motion
Concrete Walkway (F1–F2)	Improve grass growth, reduce dirt walking areas
Concrete Driveway (F3–F4)	Emergency/service vehicle access; parent convenience
Paved Parking Lots	Current lots are dirt; paving would enhance access and safety
Expanded Parking Lot	Needed due to residential development reducing space
Southwest Street Connection	Add an additional traffic exit
Fence Replacement Plan	Aging fencing needs long-term replacement strategy
Dirt Removal Around Complex	Helps level parking and improve site layout
Full Grass Replacement	Estimated cost: \$250,000 for new sod complex-wide
