During December 2025, the Wolfforth Public Library experienced continued growth across nearly all service areas, reflecting sustained community engagement despite what was historically a slower winter month. Staff remained consistently busy, with increased customer interaction throughout all areas of service. Programming and community engagement were standout strengths during the month, with our participation in the Wolfforth Small Town Christmas, school visits from Kindergarteners in the community, and our Noon Year's Eve event. Small Town Christmas is always a favorite event for staff and the community, with Taylor reading "T'was the Night Before Christmas" with Santa, and staff giving away seasonal books and hosting an ornament making craft. Another major highlight was the 2nd Annual Noon Year's Eve celebration on December 31, which drew more than double the attendance of the previous year, exceeding 100 participants and reaching full room capacity. Volunteer support also expanded significantly, with 50.16 volunteer hours contributed, helping staff meet increased demand. Overall, December 2025 demonstrated the library's growing role as an active, year-round community hub and reinforced the need to plan for continued growth in programs, services, and facility usage.
