The <u>Bipartisan Infrastructure Law</u> (BIL) established the new Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) discretionary program with \$5 billion in appropriated funds over 5 years. The SS4A program funds regional, local, and Tribal initiatives through grants to prevent roadway deaths and serious injuries.

FY23 NOFO Is Open, Now through July 10, 2023

The <u>fiscal year (FY) 2023 Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)</u> for Safe Streets and Roads for All grants is <u>live on Grants.gov</u> and open for applications.

Eligible Activities

The following activities are eligible for the SS4A program:

- Develop or update a comprehensive safety action plan (Action Plan). This includes:
 - o Developing an Action Plan;
 - o Conducting supplemental planning in support of an Action Plan; and
 - o Carrying out demonstration activities in support of an Action Plan.
- Conducting planning, design, and development activities for projects and strategies identified in an Action Pla
- Carry out projects and strategies identified in an Action Plan.

There are two types of SS4A grants: Planning and Demonstration Grants and Implementation Grants.
