Consider, and act upon, the award of contract W2023-110-A to Beehive Industries for Comprehensive Infrastructure and Asset Management Software (CIAMS) in estimated amount of \$99,800 for the initial contract base term and estimated annual amount of \$48,600 after base term and authorizing the City Manager to execute any necessary documents.

Recommendation

Motion to approve the Item as presented.

Discussion

Approval is sought to purchase a new comprehensive infrastructure and asset management software program from Beehive Industries for Public Works and the Parks and Recreation department. An evaluation committee reviewed all responsive submittals for a thorough analysis of each vendors' proposals based on scoring criteria outlined in the solicitation. Beehive Industries is the highest ranked proposer providing the most comprehensive solution.

As the City's demands and needs become more complex and costlier, it is imperative to have a software management program that optimizes system utilization for all users, improves response times, reduce errors, automates manual processes, improves analytical capabilities, and tracks reports, and improves customer service and response. The City intends to efficiently manage its total cost of ownership, enhance its current level of infrastructure asset management and improve the provision of municipal services.

The cost of CIAMS will be an estimated amount of \$99,800 for the initial term. This price also includes the implementation cost. The cost of the services for any subsequent, optional renewal of this agreement to be an estimated sum of \$48,600 per year.

Staff recommends the award of contract W2023-110-A for the Comprehensive Infrastructure and Asset Management Software to Beehive Industries in the initial estimated amount of \$99,800 with an estimated annual amount of \$48,600 for any subsequent renewal options, as providing the best value to the City.
